Community Advisory Committee on Homelessness (CACH) **BYLAWS**

Approved by the Committee: Sept. 3, 2019
Revisions per motion on Jan. 21st in red

Article I. Purpose of Committee

The Committee's purpose is to review current and previous City of Santa Cruz homelessness-related recommendations and policies; research best practices; identify current efforts related to homelessness and their effects on the community and people experiencing homelessness themselves; engage with the community; identify priorities; and make recommendations to the City Council.

Article II. Authority and Establishment of the Committee

The Committee was established by Santa Cruz City Council on June 25, 2019 and was seated on July 30th, 2019. The Committee is subject to the Brown Act and all other applicable law. The Committee is established for 9 months from the time of the first meeting, with extensions allowed with Council approval.

Article III. Organization of the Committee

(a) Committee Composition

(i) The Committee starts work with the following thirteen members (membership has been updated as of Feb. 4, 2020):

(b) Committee member withdrawal

 Members may withdraw from the Committee at any time by providing a letter of resignation to the Council, with copies to City staff to be distributed to the other Members. ii. Members may have no more than 3 unexcused absences or 5 absences total absences during the timeline established in Article II. If a Member has more than 5 absences total, they forfeit their membership. Participation by conference call is not considered an absence, must be approved by a Co-Chair in advance, and is not preferred.

(c) Convener

The Committee shall appoint a Convener to facilitate Committee meetings. The Convener has no motion authority, will not be a voting member, and serves at the pleasure of the Committee. The Convener's role is to oversee the meeting process and help provide structure and adherence to parliamentary norms. The Committee may elect to caucus to provide opportunities for informal conversations and dialog. In the absence of the Convener, the Co-Chairs will facilitate the meeting.

(d) Co-Chairs

The Committee shall elect 2 Committee members as Co-Chairs. Their responsibilities shall include: shaping meeting agendas and serving as spokespeople when communicating with the City Council at the direction of the Committee. The Co-Chairs are the point of contact to represent the will of the Committee with City staff in the event of a media request. Individual Committee members retain the right to speak on their own behalf as a member of the Committee.

(e) Quorum

A meeting or any business activity of more than half of the current membership of the Committee must be conducted in public per the Brown Act. Committee meeting will be considered to have sufficient members present to convene if there are one more than a simple majority of the current membership at the meeting.

Article IV. Roles and Communications

(a) Committee-City Council

- (i) The Committee may invite Councilmembers to meetings from time to time. The Committee appreciates if Councilmembers would not speak or actively participate in Committee meetings unless input is specifically requested by the Committee.
- (ii) The Committee will communicate with the City Council by e-mail, letter or written report which may be accompanied by an oral communication as authorized by the Committee.
- (iii) Reasons for the Committee to report to the Council include:

- 1) To provide updates on status of work;
- 2) To make recommendations based on Committee review; and
- 3) Individual Committee Members may communicate personally with Council members, within the constraints of the Brown Act. Individual Committee Members who communicate personally with Councilmembers, or at City Council meeting, will only do so on their own behalf. They will not represent the Committee unless authorized by the Committee.

(b) Committee Member - Committee Members

(i) Collaboration with an open outlook: Members will at all times keep to their commitment to the City that they will participate collaboratively and maintain an outlook that is open to new information and new outcomes. If the Committee members experience interpersonal conflict that may threaten the collaboration process toward the goals of the CACH, medication may be used.

(c) Committee-Public

- (i) Members may engage with the public to describe their experience as Members of the Committee, the information that they have learned, or any changes to their perspectives.
- (ii) Members will always make it clear when they speak or write in public that they speak for themselves, and not as a spokesperson for the Committee unless expressly directed to perform that duty by the Committee.

(d) City Staff

City staff shall:

- (i) Support the Committee's work by ensuring that appropriate resources are made available to the Committee in a timely manner, in consultation with the Co-Chairs.
- (ii) Offer suggestions and recommendations in a collaborative manner with the Committee.

Article V. Work Plan

The Committee will agree on a work plan. This will include an early agreement about the form of the work product and timeline for reports and recommendations to the public and/or City Council.

Article VI. Decision-making process

(a) General Decision Process

The Committee's decision-making processes will differ from the Council or City Commissions in that it is intended to reach consensus through a collaborative process (See glossary.) Therefore, the Committee will use this hierarchy of decision tools:

- (i) The preferred decision tool is for the Committee to arrive at a "sense of the meeting."
- (ii) Consensus is highly desirable.
- (iii) Informal voting may only be used to explore the decision space.
- (iv) Formal voting may be used as a fallback when consensus fails. Passage of a motion shall require a 2/3 majority of the members present and voting.
- (v) Mediation may be used in the event that the Committee, utilizing the agreedupon General Decision-making Process as stipulated in Article VI a (i-iv), reaches impasse.

Article VII. Meeting Procedures

- (a) Committee Meetings will occur at least monthly or as agreed upon by the Committee. Subcommittees may meet more often and if desired have city staff support when available.
 - (i) Committee members who cannot attend should notify the Co-Chairs and City staff in advance.
- (b) The meeting times shall be posted on the Committee's website and shall be given public notice similar to City Council meetings through e-mail notification, and notification shall be sent on the same timeline to homeless service providers, nonprofit, faith-based, and community organizations, within the City.
- (c) City staff will coordinate meeting materials.
 - (i) assemble the agenda with the Co-Chairs, and post the agenda 5 days in advance of any public meeting of the Committee, when feasible,

- (ii) ensure that the agenda is posted on the Committee website, shared on an email notification system, and shared with the same organizations noted in Article VII (b)
- (iii) maintain action-only meeting minutes for the Committee's review at the following meeting. Staff shall have projector available to show real time motions and amendments for Committee Members to see and vote on, and will ensure that there is a call-in number for Committee Members who are unable to attend in-person.
- (iv) meeting minutes will include an ongoing record of attendance, including Committee Members and those members of the public who choose to identify themselves.

(d) Involvement of the Public in Meetings

Each session will include an opportunity for public comment/oral communications regarding Committee-related matters with time allotted to comment decided by Committee vote. The Committee recognizes the need to accommodate members of the public that may have limited time and access to meetings and thereby will provide opportunities to comment at the beginning and end of each meeting.

Glossary

Action only minutes: these are the minutes that show the actual decisions and forward actions.

Consensus: consent of all the parties. Consensus can include "standing aside," in which one or more parties can say "I am not going to block this, but I am willing to let it go. However, I want my non-agreement to be noted."

Sense of the Meeting: After discussing an issue, often at some length, there is a palpable feeling in the room that a wise and stable decision has been reached the facilitator or Co-Chair will confirm with the group that a sense of the meeting has been achieved.

SUBJECT: Appoint of CACH Member

RECOMMENDATION: The Community Advisory Committee on Homelessness (CACH) moved on Jan. 21st to amend the CACH bylaws to allow the CACH to not fill vacant positions for the remainder of the committee's tenure. At the same meeting, the CACH requested that staff compile a comprehensive list of possible additional nominations to the CACH from the original CACH applicant pool and any new applications received by COB Jan. 24th.

BACKGROUND: On April 9, 2019, the Santa Cruz City Council moved to "develop a 10-member ad-hoc community advisory committee on homelessness composed of community members and staff representing diverse, local stakeholder/relevant subject matter from the following sectors:

- Homelessness advocate
- Health care with special focus on the local system of homelessness care and solutions
- Education
- Employment and job creation
- Local Business
- Neighborhood representative
- Community member with lived homelessness experience
- Behavioral health and/or addiction and treatment local system of care
- Policy and governmental expertise on homelessness
- Youth homelessness
- Others as identified by nomination and selection process

With the additions of:

- At least two representatives for the covering of mental health, behavioral health, and addiction services,
- Adding a student representative to the committee members, and
- Members will be appointed through an application process, with recommendations made by the Mayor and ratified by the Council."

On June 25, 2019, the City Council accepted the nominations of eleven applicants and requested the CACH itself consider adding two additional members currently experiencing homelessness. The CACH added two members at its first meeting, bringing the total roster to 13.

The CACH moved to approve their Bylaws on Sept. 3, 2019. The Bylaws designate the starting Committee composition of thirteen members.

REPORT: On December 10, 2019, Council requested that the CACH contemplate the original stakeholder representation categories when pursuing additional membership. The goal of this request is to ensure the CACH stays aligned with the original intent to be a body representing the greater community and bringing a variety of experiences and voices to the table.

For consideration of the CACH, below is a table that outlines the original stakeholder groups that appeared on the CACH application as well as the current CACH member that represent those stakeholders:

If the body chooses to increase its current membership for the final three months of its work plan, then per the City Council motion, those nominees should fill the current stakeholder group gaps, Affordable Housing, Employment Recruiter, Faith-Based Organization, and/or Violence Prevention. Should the CACH decide to proceed with nominating and moving forward with a new member be aware that staff has not yet been able to confirm all candidates' availability and interest but will do so before the schedule meeting of Feb. 4th, 2020.

IV. Questions

a. Why do you think that you are an ideal candidate to participate on the CACH? (250 words or less)

I am a long time mental health clinician trained in community mental health with expertise in domestic and sexual violence, substance abuse/addiction, and post traumatic stress disorder which are common issues that many to most unhoused individuals are struggling to solve.

As a current volunteer with the Downtown Streets Team I have the opportunity for conversations with folks who are currently unhoused and working hard to make changes in their lives. My ideas for possible solutions are informed by talking with current DST members.

As a recent City Council candidate I spent many months going door to door in our City talking with literally thousands of voters about their core concerns. The number one issue raised by most was neighborhood safety and the impact of the growing homeless population on our neighborhoods our parks and beaches. I am very aware of how many of our neighbors are struggling themselves to stay in their homes and fearful that the current problems faced by the City cannot be solved.

As a former elected school board trustee, who served as Board President twice, I led charged public meetings and committees with hundreds of impassioned constituents sharing their concerns twice a month for 8 years. I have the skills to facilitate conversations about contentious topics with a transparent inclusive process and an eye toward effective outcomes.

And in the 80's I had the opportunity to work with SJPD and mental health in an earlier version of the current Santa Cruz MERT program that helped inform my work and build compassion for those with untreated mental illness living on the streets of San Jose.

- b. What relevant traits, skills, experience, education would you bring to the CACH? (150 words or less)
 - Trained listener (M.S. MFT) with 30 years of proven communications skills and conflict resolution skills both in private practice and community service.
 - 30+ years experience working with mental illness, addiction, employment, and local government systems
 - Deep understanding and compassion for people in our community struggling to heal from addiction/ untreated mental illness
 - Experience leading or serving on working committees with a mandate to solve problems facing our community and State such as: BASTA, Finding Common Ground (with SC Indivisible), current chair of the Community Engagement Committee (for the DCC) current elected CADEM delegate for Region 7, Founder and former Chair of the Santa Cruz County School Boards Association, and former elected delegate for the State of California School Boards Association (district 9) for two terms.

Organizer for SC Women's March 2017, 2018, 2019 insuring diverse, inclusive, peaceful, family friendly event by working collaboratively with City Staff, SCPD and community groups such as ACLU, Diversity Center, Resource Center for Nonviolence.

c. Homelessness can be a contentious topic in our community. It is critical that CACH members have excellent communication skills. Please provide an example of your ability to communicate effectively with opposing points of view to your own. (150 words or less)

As a Psychotherapist in private practice conflict resolution is an important tool in my practice. The basic skill in my day job for over 30 years has been to teach and model effective communication skills and clear communication.

On the campaign trail a few months ago I knocked on the doors of voters daily for months and had conversations with very concerned and sometimes angry neighbors about how untreated mental illness/ addiction and homelessness is changing the character of our neighborhoods and parks. We also had charged conversations about Measure M, a volatile topic on both sides of the issue. Standing in the doorway with someone who doesn't agree with you with the goal of earning their vote is a great exercise in clear communication, active listening, and patience.

d. Is there any other information that you would like to share? (150 words or less)

I am a long time resident of the City of Santa Cruz. I am also a renter with a modest income and am very aware of the issue of housing insecurity and the anxiety shared by homeowners and renters alike in our changing housing market. As an active community member I have developed good relationships with SCPD Chief Mills and his staff and support the work of Downtown Streets Team, the Homeless Garden Project, and HSC. Our community cares about solutions and a great example was the huge turnout the other night for the Soupline fundraiser for HSC.

Any committee hoping to craft effective solutions for our neighbors who are unhoused and our neighbors who are concerned about the impact homelessness/ addiction has on our community has to acknowledge the role fear plays in publicly expressed anger. Everyone wants to feel safe, no matter where they live.

The Mayor will review the applications and select the CACH participants in a manner that broadly represents the community. The City Council will ratify the Mayor's appointments. Applicants will be notified of their selection status in late May 2019.

Not only am I a fairty large land Ideal Candidate - 250 Words or Less are rented to section 8 tenants—one of the clearer paths to housing for low income and nomeless loss. Thave during my 30 year tenure as a Santa Cruz landlord brought six homeless folks into permanent housing through housing choice vouchers—many VASH voucher tenants.

I also have apartment units in three other counties and have worked with their respective housing authorites in placing section 8 tenants at these properties (San Leandro, Vacaville, Salinas, and Monterey).

As a result of my experience with the challenges of providing housing in Santa Cruz, I am very familiar with the unique challenges faced by low income citizens in finding and KEEPING their housing—an item that is just as important as finding the housing itself.

Further, I am familiar with the challenges faced in building new housing and the significant costs associated with building in Santa Cruz and California for that matter. I have gone through the permitting process both in Santa Cruz and other cities/counties as well.

b. What relevant traits, skills, experience, education would you bring to the CACH? (150 words or less)

The key skills I bring to the CACH are

1) my experience as a landlord well-versed with the HUD section 8 program, dealing with low-income

and homeless folks seeking permanent, clean, safe housing

2) my experience as a realtor and real estate professional in what it takes to locate suitable facilities or land for potential emergency shelter and transitional or permanent housing. I understand the frailties and biases of property owners that may make them reluctant to entertain uses that include sheltering the homeless.

3) my formal education includes BSEE and MSEE degrees from Camegie Mellon and a BA from the

Pennsylvania State University

- 4) experience with the controversial and at times, toxic, public discussion of homelessness in Santa Cruz through my extensive participation in focus groups, public forums, and city council meetings that focus on homelessness.
- c. Homelessness can be a contentious topic in our community. It is critical that CACH members have excellent communication skills. Please provide an example of your ability to communicate effectively with opposing points of view to your own. (150 words or less)

One only has to examine my track record of public communications in the Sentinel, at City Council meetings and on social media to see that I maintain a balanced, vulgarity-free and civil approach to the discussion of homelessness in Santa Cruz.

d. Is there any other information that you would like to share? (150 words or less)

I would like to emphasize my attempts at reaching out to property owners in search of a site for an "encampment" of some kind to help mitigate the homelessness problem in Santa Cruz. I've reached out to property owners on Dubois St., River St., rural Santa Cruz county and empty commercial buildings to explore developing a demonstration homeless shelter and service provider facility. Not surprisingly, they have all turned down my inquiries.

Further, I believe there is a glaring lack of reliable data concerning the homeless in Santa Cruz. Where do they come from? How long have they been here? What led them to homelessness? What are they doing do extract themselves from it? What would they expect from the community to assist them? I have 220 brand new rain coats and pants that I want to give away in exchange for 15-20 minute interviews with homeless folks to gain reliable, not anecdotal, answers. This data would provide critical information that would allow us to tailor programs and policies for addressing the homelessness issue. I have already put together several volunteers that could perform these interviews say at the downtown library all purpose room.

The Mayor will review the applications and select the CACH participants in a manner that broadly represents the community. The City Council will ratify the Mayor's appointments. Applicants will be notified of their selection status in late May 2019.

IV. Questions

a. Why do you think that you are an ideal candidate to participate on the CACH? (250 words or less)

I have lived in Santa Cruz for over twenty years and have watched the situation of those without homes become worse and worse. As a business and homeowner, as someone well supported by family and friends, I understand the magnitude of my personal luck. Being part of an effort to help with the painful issue of homelessness would be a great privilege. In the various debates about this issue, we hear from commercial homeowners, housing-connected businesses, advocates for the homeless and the poor, and from those who are homeless themselves.

One group is not represented, those who own or rent homes and are unable to express their opinions except through biased channels. They are largely silent and fundamentally generous people. They are part of the fabric of this town. For the moment, they don't know how to help and would most certainly support a solution that is both fair and effective, a solution that is generous. I'd like to speak on their behalf.

b. What relevant traits, skills, experience, education would you bring to the CACH? (150 words or less)

As a business owner, particularly of a technical company, I have learned some valuable negotiating skills, the ability to articulate ideas, understand complex issues, and make decisions.

Part of my work in the recent past was to publish a magazine for which I researched and wrote articles. The ability to use simple, understandable language to convey an idea is critical to developing a solution.

I am comfortable in all social circles except possibly hostile ones, and speak several languages including functional Spanish.

c. Homelessness can be a contentious topic in our community. It is critical that CACH members have excellent communication skills. Please provide an example of your ability to communicate effectively with opposing points of view to your own. (150 words or less)

Aside from understanding the urgency of finding a humane and dignified solution for people without housing, I have no strong point of view.

In the immediate, I believe that the Gateway camp should stay open, improved and made safe. I support the plan to temporarily move the inhabitants, by sections if necessary, so that the camp can be cleaned and flooring provided. That would resolve the issue of salubrity. A most urgent issue is self governance. We must prevail on the outside activists who currently help the population with water, food, and medical care. They have formed a relationship of trust with the inhabitants and must meet with them to organize a type of government to monitor criminal behavior outside and inside the camp.

Finally, to appease the discomfort of many on seeing the camp from River Street, let's erect fences or bushes to hide the camp from the street.

d. Is there any other information that you would like to share? (150 words or less)

As a homeowner, I voted for Measure M. As a business owner, I voted to raise minimum wage in Santa Cruz. I will never let my personal situation interfere with the interests of a community in need. I have no personal or financial stake in this except a deeply ingrained desire to help develop a solution that will restore the dignity and happiness of our citizens in need, and that will calm our agitated community.

I have a deep respect for our civil servants, our teachers, firefighters, police and I know that they are finding it difficult to afford a life in the city that they serve. I would like to know that none of these will ever be either forced out of the city or into the homeless population.

Please let me be part of finding a good, fair, dignified solution that will make our whole population feel whole again.

IV. Questions

a. Why do you think that you are an ideal candidate to participate on the CACH? (250 words or less)

Given the complexity of the homelessness issue the best candidates will be those who have some and perhaps a lot of knowledge about it. Good candidates are also ones who can acknowledge their particular point of view, are willing to listen to the views of others, give them serious consideration, and, having taken all this into consideration, make a suggestion, or propose an action they can defend. I would like to think that I possess those qualifications. I have had enough years experience both as an administrator and serving on Boards that I know I can listen, evaluate pretty fairly and then take a reasoned position. If I disagree with a decision I may continue to defend my point of view but in the end will support the majority action.

My knowledge of housing issues, resources and politics is good. I also know I have more to learn. Because of my background in public health I would be a strong advocate for proposals that improve health and sanitation. Being housed is the most important health improvement for everyone but there are other actions I would work hard for such as availability of toilets, washing facilities and acceptable places for people to sit and even lie down during the day. As a home owner I can empathize with those who fear having homeless shelters or services in their neighborhoods! At the same time I feel strongly about finding and supporting approaches that will give shelter to as many unhoused individuals as possible even if that gives me some personal discomfort.

b. What relevant traits, skills, experience, education would you bring to the CACH? (150 words or less)

My academic background has always had advocacy at it's core. My academic training included environmental policy and public health planning, both of which required me to sharpen my advocacy skills. Wanting to achieve certain goals. I often spoke with officials and groups that required convincing. To achieve any success I had to learn to listen, compromise, stand firm or even gracefully retreat.

Beyond that I care very strongly about the the unhoused. My public health focus has always been primarily on underserved populations, particularly farm workers. That was one of the first places I saw clearly the relationship between lack of housing and poor health. While Childrens Public Health Services Manager for Santa Cruz County I and two others spearheaded the effort to establish the Dientes Dental Clinic. In conjunction the HPHP we were able to obtain funding for many homeless clients. I continue to advocate for any services that will improve the health status of this population.

c. Homelessness can be a contentious topic in our community. It is critical that CACH members have excellent communication skills. Please provide an example of your ability to communicate effectively with opposing points of view to your own. (150 words or less)

My goal when communicating with someone whose views differ from mine is to be sure I understand their perspective and do what I can to have mine heard. When we disagree I try to remain calm, speak in "I" statements, listen and ask clarifying questions. I've often been told I'm intense. When that happens I also try to censor myself and make sure I'm giving others a chance to speak.

One skill I keep working on is expressing back to someone what I think they said and in a way that they feel heard. It's hard sometimes not to get carried away and fail to do this. Never the less, when I remember to reflect back what was said I can then ask permission to give my point of view and often it will be granted. Whether I changed someones perspective or conviction is often impossible to know.

d. Is there any other information that you would like to share? (150 words or less)

Over the past two years I've learned a lot about the nature of homelessness as it's being played out in California and in Santa Cruz. I'm a member of the Community Action Board of Santa Cruz, an active part of its Advocacy Committee and have focused on housing among other issues. In addition to following the actions of the City Council on housing I've attended several CACH meetings and continue taking other steps to become better informed. My now deceased partner was a tireless homeless and low income housing advocate in Northern California and I learned a great deal from his quiet, firm commitment. When I feel discouraged or angry about the slowness of change it's my memories of his patient determination as much as anything that keep me going.



a. Why do you think that you are an ideal candidate to participate on the CACH? (250 words or less)

As Director of Programs at Homeless Services Center (HSC), I am familiar with the services landscape in Santa Cruz, and as a resident of Santa Cruz who spends a lot of time enjoying the benefits of our city, I relate to the concerns voiced by people in response to the issue of homelessness. My experience in homeless services is matched by my desire to live in a city with a great quality of life and with cooperation and camaraderie with my neighbors. I have experience interacting with a diverse set of people, from walking down the street and saying hi to people in my neighborhood, serving the individuals who come to HSC for assistance, participating in community policy and government meetings, and engaging with business owners and leaders in Santa Cruz. There are multiple qualities I would like to contribute to the CACH: expertise in homeless services, a positive and constructive voice in the community, a broad view that takes into account other (and sometimes opposing) perspectives, and a goal of powerful solutions. I am not approaching the CACH with a solution or suggestion in mind, but want to be part of a process that leads shared understanding and is able to lead to positive actions.

b. What relevant traits, skills, experience, education would you bring to the CACH? (150 words or less)

For the past two years, I have been the Director of Programs at HSC, and I have an additional six years of experience in the field of homeless services, as well as additional work experience in low-income housing, workforce development, and youth . In 2016, I earned a Masters of Public Administration with projects focused on policy analysis, project sustainability, and systems thinking. I am familiar and have practice in processes like logic models, design thinking, and other tools for problem solving and program development.

c. Homelessness can be a contentious topic in our community. It is critical that CACH members have excellent communication skills. Please provide an example of your ability to communicate effectively with opposing points of view to your own. (150 words or less)

I am a frequent participant in collaborative meetings such as the Homeless Action Partnership, Smart Path Coordinated Entry and 180/2020 Housing Workgroup, and the stakeholder engagement meetings for the HEAP and CESH funding streams. I value listening and looking for common ground, and I am experienced in difficult conversations as a leader and supervisor in my career. In addition, I regularly receive phone calls or emails with feedback from community members who have concerns about homelessness or HSC's services. I take care to treat everyone respectfully, act professionally as a representative of HSC, and aim to give people a chance to express themselves while responding with information that may give insight to what we are doing or why we are doing it. The issue of homelessness is one that wraps many emotions into it and we need to carefully unwrap the layers around it.

Although my role as Director of Programs at HSC is a focus for my interest in CACH, the issue of homelessness is one I see daily in my personal life walking around my neighborhood in Seabright, jogging on the San Lorezo River levee, using local parks, surfing and playing on local beaches, visiting libraries, and in frequent trips to downtown Santa Cruz. I strive to be out in
public spaces every day, and my experiences interacting with people in town guides my perspectives beyond my professional experience.

d. Is there any other information that you would like to share? (150 words or less)
