# Overview of the City of Santa Cruz Children's Fund

## **Brief History**

- 2014: Voters approved <u>Measure L</u>, amending the Santa Cruz Municipal Code to impose a tax on cannabis businesses operating in the City (Cannabis Tax).
- 2017: City Council adopted a <u>Council policy</u> to allocate General Fund revenue equivalent to 12.5% of the funds generated by the Cannabis Tax to a dedicated <u>Children's Fund</u>.
- 2021: Voters approved Measure A, institutionalizing the existing Council Policy in the City Charter and increasing the amount of General Fund revenue allocated to the Children's Fund to the equivalent of 20% of funds generated by the Cannabis Tax.

## Purpose & Intent

To support enhancement and expansion of evidenced-based programs to prioritize access to early childhood development, prevention, and vulnerable youth programs, without supplanting existing City of Santa Cruz services or investments. (City Charter)

Monies in the Santa Cruz Children's Fund are to be used to provide services to Santa Cruz children and youth less than twenty-five (25) years old, in accordance with asset-based youth development principles, and placing a strategic priority on serving those children and youth most impacted by poverty, trauma, and violence. (Measure A)

## Why This Matters

- A. Cities benefit when youth live safe, peaceful, and healthy lives free from involvement with the juvenile and criminal justice systems.
- B. By helping City of Santa Cruz children and youth to succeed in school and graduate high school prepared for college, career, and community, the City of Santa Cruz will benefit.
- C. Fostering the healthy development of young children, ages 0-5 years old, will have a positive impact on the Santa Cruz community.

#### Parameters

- 20% of audited revenue from Cannabis Tax
- Available funding is calculated based on the prior year's audited financial statements
- Permanent: can only be rescinded or amended by a future vote

#### **Parameters**

Monies in the Santa Cruz Children's Fund shall not be appropriated or expended for:


- Any service which merely benefits children and youth incidentally;
- Acquisition, lease, or maintenance of any capital item or real property not for primary and direct use by children and youth; or
- Any service for which a fixed or minimum level of expenditure is mandated by state or federal law, to the extent of the fixed or minimum level of expenditure.

## Oversight

The City Council shall designate a community oversight panel to make recommendations on the use of future revenues in a manner consistent with this Section which may include, but shall not be limited to, representatives of the following:

- The City's Parks and Recreation Commission
- The Santa Cruz City School District
- First Five Santa Cruz
- Youth Organizations
- The City Council

Administered By	Allocation	Description
Neighborhood Childcare Center	\$15,000	Funds were used to maintain the program's sliding scale fee structure to ensure childcare was provided to diverse socio- economic backgrounds and diverse family structures.
Santa Cruz Toddler Care Center	\$5,000	Funds were used to provide scholarships to low-income families, allowing them to access high quality early education.
Foster Grandparent Program	\$3,000	Funds were used to improve the academic skills of 1st-3rd grade children in the City of Santa Cruz Elementary School District who had fallen behind in school.

## CF Allocations: Early Childhood Programs

**Description:** Early Learning Scholarships (ELS) are distributed to childcare providers operating within the City of Santa Cruz, based on the number of children (ages 0-5) served. ELS are intended to help childcare providers deal with the extraordinary costs associated with providing safe, high-quality early care and education to young children, which was particularly essential during the pandemic.

# CF Allocations: Youth Programs

**Description:** FOPAR youth scholarships are available to limited-income families residing within the City of Santa Cruz to use toward recreation activity fees. All Children's Fund dollars are placed into a restricted scholarship account, ensuring that 100% of Children's fund dollars are used for youth scholarships.
