Implementation Plan

As indicated in the introduction, the revitalization of the Mission Street corridor is anticipated to be a long-term effort. That being said, the implementation program is based on the belief that the sooner the recommended improvement and enforcement programs are initiated the sooner the character of the corridor will begin to change. The following time frame for implementing the Corridor Urban Design Plan is not date-specific, but is intended to identify a general time frame and order of priorities. It is understood that the actual timing of implementation will be a function of the budgeting process and the ability to obtain the resources necessary to support each task.

The implementation program is set out in two three-year programs. It assumes that the proposed actions build on the success of previous actions, rather than taking place all at one time. The emphasis in the first three years is on establishing the regulatory and detailed design framework for the revitalization program, and implementing those actions that are already in the pipeline. The second three years focus on implementation of actions for which the groundwork will be set in the first three-year period. Although not listed, the implementation program also assumes a third category following the first six years in which many of the actions that have been initiated will continue to be implemented in a phased and on-going manner.
