
Downtown Plan Expansion 2023 Survey Results

Survey open from August 18 through September 10, 2023

- 1. Create **opportunities for public amenities** and infrastructure such as parks, the Santa Cruz Riverwalk trail, or other spaces for community use.
- 2. Increase the total number of housing units that can be built in the City by **adding capacity for multi-family housing.**
- 3. Better connect downtown with the river and beach areas, which will:
 - 1. Give the community better access to the river and beach
 - 2. Help visitors see more of Santa Cruz, including its local businesses
- 4. Improve the pedestrian experience through thoughtful urban design measures
- 5. Create new economic opportunities for both businesses and workers
- 6. Work with the Warriors to establish land use allowances for a permanent arena
- 7. Generate new tax revenue for the City



Summarized comments:


The survey responses regarding the circulation network are largely positive, with many participants supporting the objectives to improve pedestrian and bike access. Respondents appreciate the efforts to enhance public plazas but also highlight the need to consider existing public spaces and land constraints. Overall, there's strong agreement on the proposed improvements, indicating a collective desire for a more accessible and well-connected downtown area. Some respondents call out the need for improved access to the Beach Hill neighborhood for residents.

Summarized Comments:

Feedback on transportation recommendations also included a significant number of references to the City's Homeless Response in relation to the Riverwalk. Respondents emphasize the need for better access and signage to key transportation hubs, as well as enhanced bicycle and pedestrian infrastructure. While the suggestions are constructive, they also reflect a concern for maintaining cleanliness and both real and perceived safety on the Riverwalk.



Summarized Comments:

The responses about Spruce Street Plaza are enthusiastic, with many ideas for adding public amenities such as seating areas, green spaces, and public art. There is a strong desire for community events and regular maintenance to keep the plaza inviting. Safety and security are also important concerns, reflecting the community's commitment to creating a vibrant and welcoming public space. Again, some respondents cautioned that success for the plaza will depend on the ability to maintain order and minimize antisocial behavior while still being welcoming to locals and visitors of all ages, abilities, and economic status.

Summarized Comments:





Summarized Comments:

Responses about streetscape features highlight the need for pedestrian-friendly amenities like benches, shade, and drinking fountains. Participants suggest beautification projects, including public art and improved lighting, and recommend traffic calming measures for pedestrian safety. There is also a strong interest in integrating green infrastructure to enhance the urban environment.




Which of the following uses are you most interested in at a new permanent arena?

Summarized Comments:

Opinions on the arena are mixed, with some respondents concerned about the potential for the use of public funds for its development. However, there is interest in community engagement and designing the arena for multiple uses beyond sports events. Sustainability features are also recommended, reflecting a desire for responsible and inclusive development. Community members hope there will be an opportunity to work with developers on the design of the Arena and its' interaction with community spaces.

Summarized Comments:




