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# ANALYSIS OF POLLUTANTS IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 307(A) OF THE CLEAN WATER ACT, POLLUTANTS CONTRIBUTING TO PASS-THROUGH

This section of the report contains data summaries, graphs and narratives to provide analyses of pollutants identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act (CWA) for samples of POTW influent, effluent and dewatered sludge that might have contributed to pass-through in 2010.

The pretreatment program and the laboratory collaborated to deploy integrative sampling devices in the effluent troughs during two thirty-day sampling periods in 2009, and in the effluent trough once in 2010. These devices are prescribed in the NPDES permit CA 0048194, issued to the City in 2005. The underlying technologies enable the facility to better evaluate the fate of trace organic compounds through the wastewater treatment facility, and contribute ways for the pretreatment program to assess the effectiveness of the source control programs of the City to limit the potential for pass-through. This novel process, originally developed by the United States Geological Survey (USGS) utilizes the fugacity of trace organic compounds in water to sequester the compounds into a semi-permeable membrane, at standard temperatures over a longer period of typically 30 days. The membrane is processed under license and a patent agreement granted by USGS to Environmental Sampling Technologies, Inc. (EST), St. Joseph, MO. Thereafter the ampoules of chemical extracts were analyzed with approved EPA analytical methods. Data from the processes have been analyzed for evidence of pass-through for compounds that have become amenable to analyses. The data are presented subsequently in this section.

Later in the report we present the data developed largely from these technologies and utilized for the revision of our Local Limits for regulating discharge through the wastewater treatment facility. The exercise of developing and revising the Local limits took three years and assistance of an engineering consulting firm – Kennedy/Jenks Associates.

Highlights of the new limits include the first comprehensive limits for trace organics and specific pesticides as well as new limits for priority pollutants including TSS.

The analyses of data on conventional priority pollutants including metals and nutrients indicate that there was no pass-through and the treatment processes remain effective as configured to meet secondary treatment standards.

Finally, there was no violation of the MRP No 00-044 during the period covered by this report.

The monitoring data indicate that compliance with the Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) and Monitoring Requirement Program (MRP) has been good, and no problems are anticipated for 2011.




NPDES Limit 1: Average Dry Weather Maximum Effluent Flow 17 MGD

NPDES LIMIT 2: Maximum Daily Effluent Flow: 81 MGD





### UPSET, INTERFERENCE, AND PASS-THROUGH

The pretreatment program had two broad review exercises where Plant and Program records were evaluated for local limits revision; and specifically for upsets, interferences and pass-through in 2010. These included the Local Limits revision exercise completed in July 2010, and the annual report development, which culminated in this report.

Although there was one (1) incident of TOC removal limit failure in 2010, all the data indicate that this was not an incident of pass-through, interference or upset. No incident of pass-through, interference or upset was documented throughout the calendar year 2010, (please refer to data and report summary in Section I. Analyses of Pollutants Identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act, Pollutants contributing to Pass-Through).

In addition to the review exercises mentioned above, the pretreatment program was able to evaluate the plant effluent loads of trace organic compounds; and commonly analyzed metals through the plant and into the discharge area. The trace organic loads' analyses were done through the implementation of the integrative sampling devices during the dry season in 2010, and the review of metals analyses in 2010 was performed with the semi-annual effluent data of the same period.

As a result of the implementation of the integrative sampling processes, it has been possible to conclude an update of the Local Limits, and implement an updated listing in 2010. The newer limits are presented in this section following this introduction.

The City is continuing to evaluate professional laboratories with expanded capabilities to develop a clearer evaluation of all the compounds in the State's Ocean Plan's Table B during 2010.


In conclusion, the data indicate that compliance with the WDR and MRP requirements has been good, and no problems are anticipated for 2011

#### **BASELINE MONITORING REPORTS**

Industry Baseline Monitoring Reports (BMR) have been reviewed in order to reflect any changes undertaken by permitted industries during the course of 2010.

Changes in status include:

- One IU, City of Santa Cruz Water Department discontinued temporary wastewater discharge from its pilot desalination plant, which was operated under permit through June 2010. The discharge to sewer met the limits and conditions of the permit. The permit has been terminated with the successful completion of the project. The site was closed and treatment equipment was removed as of April 16, 2010.
- One IU, **Cal Clean (Beacon Station #3528)** was issued a temporary wastewater discharge permit for discharging treated water from a groundwater remediation system. The permit is now closed.
- One IU, **Sav-On-Gas** was issued a wastewater discharge permit for discharging treated water from a groundwater remediation system.
- One IU, **Valero**—installed an in-situ oxygen diffusion groundwater treatment remediation system on June 16, 2010. The previously installed groundwater pump and treat remediation system they had in place was dismantled, and they no longer discharge wastewater from the groundwater system into the City's sewer facility.

All Industrial Permit users were current through 2010, and as a result, no new permits were reissued for Industrial Users in 2010.



2010 FOURTH C	<b>DUARTERLY STATUS REPORT</b>

The following section includes significant program activities completed during the fourth quarter of 2010, including the compliance table and narrative summary of industrial users in violation of applicable pretreatment standards in the fourth quarter of 2010.

During the fourth quarter of 2010, the City updated the Local Limits based upon monitoring information developed over the preceding five years, and specifically informed about the changes in the industrial users composition of the City.

The updated Local Limits have been presented in two tables earlier in the annual report. A copy of the updated Sewer Use Ordinance now follows on the next five (5) pages:

#### ORDINANCE NO. 2010-20

#### AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF SANTA CRUZ AMENDING SECTION 16.08.110 OF THE SANTA CRUZ MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO WASTEWATER DISCHARGES INTO THE CITY SEWER SYSTEM

BE IT ORDAINED By The City Of Santa Cruz As Follows:

Section 1: Section 16.08.110 of the Santa Cruz Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

#### 16.08.110 PROHIBITIONS AND LIMITATIONS ON WASTEWATER DISCHARGES.

- (a) General Prohibitions on Wastewater Discharges. No person shall introduce, discharge, convey, or permit or allow to be discharged or conveyed, to a public sewer any wastewater containing pollutants of such character or quantity that will:
- (1) Interfere with the process or efficiency of the wastewater treatment system or not be susceptible to treatment.
- (2) Constitute a slug loading.
- (3) Cause a pass through or interference to occur at the POTW, either alone or in combination with a discharge(s) from other sources.
- (4) Be at a discharge flow rate that would exceed the carrying capacity of the sanitary sewer.
- (5) Violate state or federal pretreatment standards.
- (6) Inhibits the processing, use, or disposal of sludge.
- (7) Violate any of the provisions of this chapter.
- (b) Specific Prohibitions on Wastewater Discharges. No person shall discharge or cause or allow to be discharged into POTW any wastewater which contains the following:
- (1) Flammables and Explosives.
- (A) Explosive mixtures, liquids, solids, or gases that are or may be sufficient, either alone or by interaction with other substances, to cause fire or explosion or be injurious in any other way to any persons, the wastewater treatment system or to the operation of the system. At no time shall two successive readings on an explosion hazard meter, at the point of discharge into the sewer system, be more than five percent nor any single reading over ten percent of the lower explosive limit (LEL) of the meter. When calibrating explosion hazard meters, the meter shall be calibrated using a representative standard of the combustibles expected to be present in the wastewater discharge. If a methane standard is used, the meter alarm shall be set at the lowest LEL for those combustibles expected to be present in the wastewater discharge.
- (B) Pollutants which create a fire or explosion hazard in the POTW including, but not limited to, waste streams with a closed cup flash point of less than 60°C or 140°F using test methods specified in 40 CFR 261.21.

- (2) Corrosive Wastes. Pollutants that cause corrosive structural damage to the POTW, but in no case discharges with a pH less than 5.0
- (3) Solid or Viscous Pollutants. Solid or viscous pollutants in amounts which may cause obstruction to the flow in the POTW or interfere with the proper operation of the wastewater treatment system.
- (4) Flow Rate and/or Pollutant Concentration. Any pollutant, including oxygen-demanding pollutants (BOD, TOC, etc.), released in a discharge at a flow rate and/or pollutant concentration which will cause interference with the POTW.
- (5) Temperature. Heat in amounts that will inhibit biological activity in the POTW resulting in interference, but in no case heat in such quantities that the temperature at the POTW exceeds 40°C (104°F).
- (6) Oil and Grease. Petroleum oil, cutting oil, or products of mineral oil origin in amounts that will cause interference or pass-through.
- (7) Gases, Vapors, Fumes. Pollutants which result in the presence of toxic gases, vapors, or fumes within the POTW in a quantity that may cause acute worker health and safety problems.
- (8) Transported Pollutants. Any trucked or hauled pollutants, except at discharge points designated by the POTW.
- (9) Noxious Materials. Noxious or malodorous solids, liquids or gases, which, whether singly or by interaction with other wastes, are capable of creating an odor nuisance or hazard to life, or are sufficient to prevent entry into a sewer for its maintenance and repair.
- (10) Toxic Substances. Any toxic substances in amounts exceeding standards promulgated by the Administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency pursuant to Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act. Also included are any chemical elements or compounds, or other taste or odor producing substances, or any other substances which are not susceptible to treatment or which may interfere with the biological processes or efficiency of the wastewater treatment system, or that will pass through the POTW, or that will accumulate to toxic levels in marine waters, sediments or biota.
- (11) Radioactive Wastes. Except as allowed in this chapter, no user shall discharge or permit to be discharged any radioactive waste into the public sewer.
- (12) Waste Radiator Coolant. Waste radiator coolant or any radiator flushing wastewater generated from auto, truck, or equipment maintenance.
- (13) Discolored Material. Wastes with objectionable color not removable by the wastewater treatment system, which cause discoloration of the POTW effluent such that receiving water quality requirements established by law cannot be met.
- (14) Engine and Vehicle Parts Cleaning Wastes. Wastewater or other wastes from the cleaning of engines, undercarriages or vehicle parts. Such wastes must be either recycled in a closed-loop recycling system or hauled off-site for proper disposal.
- (15) Hazardous Waste. Hazardous waste as defined by the California Code of Regulations (CCR) at 22 CCR 66261.3.

(c) Specific Limitations on Wastewater Discharges. The following are the maximum concentrations of pollutants allowable in wastewater discharges to the wastewater treatment system, unless state or federal limits are lower in which case those limits shall control. Dilution of any wastewater discharge for the purpose of satisfying these pretreatment standards or any applicable pretreatment standards shall be considered a violation of this chapter and is prohibited.

Grab samples must be used for pH, cyanide, oil and grease, sulfide, and volatile organic compounds. Composite samples for 24 hours or other time period approved by the director are required for all other parameters, using flow-proportional techniques where feasible.



#### VI. Summary of Compliance and Enforcement Activities

**BAY PHOTO** - was inconsistently achieving compliance throughout 2010. One City 24-hour monitoring event found silver was being discharged from the pretreatment system at an average concentration of 84 ppm, resulting in a discharge to the sewer main of 1.1 ppm, both in violation of the 0.7 local limit. A Notice of Violation was issued to the business and an increased frequency, every 30 days, of self-monitoring was implemented for the final 6 months of 2010, in addition to almost monthly monitoring by the City. Subsequent to this violation of silver concentration, all samples from Bay Photo's pretreatment system have been in compliance with local limits.

PERSYS - was in compliance throughout 2010.

SANTA CRUZ CLASS III LANDFILL - was in compliance throughout 2010.

**HARMONY FOODS** – was in compliance throughout 2010. A single upset in operations at Harmony Foods caused the discharge of wastewater with a concentration of total suspended solids at 5,800 mg/L in violation of the 3,000 mg/L local limit. Harmony Foods subsequently retested the wastewater and found they had come back into compliance, a result verified by the City.

**SANTA CRUZ BIOTECHNOLOGY** – was in compliance throughout 2010.

SANTA CRUZ CLASS III LANDFILL – was in compliance throughout 2010.
SANTA CRUZ COUNTY FLEET SERVICES/RRM – (treated groundwater discharger) – was in compliance throughout 2010.
SANTA CRUZ WATER PLANT (Graham Hill Rd) – was in compliance throughout 2010.
UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AT SANTA CRUZ (UCSC) – was in compliance throughout 2010.

#### PRETREATMENT PROGRAM CHANGES


The Pretreatment program at the City of Santa Cruz completed the technical update to the Local Limits to regulate discharge into the wastewater treatment facility in 2010. The new limits were promulgated into the Sewer Use Ordinance in November 2010. Highlights of the new limits are the incorporation of numeric limits for trace organics, upward revision of the limit for Total Suspended Solids, and the reduction of Arsenic loads acceptable to the WWTF.

Additionally, the Environmental Compliance program at the City operates the Pretreatment program and has had the responsibilities for storm water monitoring and inspections since 2003, and since 2007. The program has utilized the integrated high volume water sampling technologies of SPMD (Semi Permeable Membrane Devices) to calculate potential effluent loads and pass through of trace organics in the effluent.

Finally, the City continued the program for safe and responsible disposal of unwanted pharmaceuticals as a free program to the community to prevent their common discharge into the sewer system, and as a way to divert them from the ocean and surface waters. Otherwise, there are few program changes to report for 2010.

Three of the significant program developments in 2010 are as follows:

- **1. Local Limits:** The City concluded the revision of the Local Limits and updated the Sewer Use Ordinance accordingly. The revision was undertaken because of the changed profile of the major dischargers into the sewer system and the ability to treat higher levels of solids for the community.
- **2. Compounds of Emerging Concern:** The Pretreatment program analyzed the data from simultaneous deployment of an integrative sampling technology into monitoring for trace and toxicologically significant compounds at the end of the dry weather season in 2009 and the effluent in 2010. The analyses indicate that the compounds do not currently pose challenges for violations and/or pass-through at the facility, and the data was integral to the revision of the Local Limits concluded in 2010. And
- 3. Program Organization and Staffing: The Pretreatment program finally filled the vacancy for a third Environmental Compliance Inspector position in August 2010. This allowed the implementation of a geographic grid of responsibility within City limits for staff Inspectors, and consequently this should translate to more proactive inspections, patrols, and more effective intervention.





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# ANALYSIS OF POLLUTANTS IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 307(A) OF THE CLEAN WATER ACT, POLLUTANTS CONTRIBUTING TO PASS-THROUGH

This section of the report contains data summaries, graphs and narratives to provide analyses of pollutants identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act (CWA) for samples of POTW influent, effluent and dewatered sludge that might have contributed to pass-through in 2009.

The pretreatment program and the laboratory collaborated to deploy integrative sampling devices in influent and effluent troughs during the same thirty-day sampling periods in 2009. These devices are prescribed in the NPDES permit CA 0048194, issued to the City in 2005. The underlying technologies enable the facility to better evaluate the fate of trace organic compounds through the wastewater treatment facility, and contribute ways for the pretreatment program to assess the effectiveness of the source control programs of the City to limit the potential for pass-through. This novel process, originally developed by the United States Geological Survey (USGS) utilizes the fugacity of trace organic compounds in water to sequester the compounds into a semi-permeable membrane, at standard temperatures over a longer period of typically 30 days. The membrane is processed under license and a patent agreement granted by USGS to Environmental Sampling Technologies, Inc. (EST), St. Joseph, MO. Thereafter the ampoules of chemical extracts are analyzed with approved EPA analytical methods. Data from the processes have been analyzed for evidence of pass-through for compounds that have become amenable to analyses. The data are presented subsequently in this section, and they indicate that many of the previously detectable compounds were better measurable in the effluent than in the influent in 2009; where the data is clearest, there are perceived reductions in the concentrations of the trace organic compounds; and the declines in the concentration and variety of trace organic compounds detectable at the influent and effluent of the wastewater treatment facility during 2009, continue to be better than the data compiled for 2007.

The analyses of data on conventional priority pollutants including metals and nutrients indicate that there was no pass-through and the treatment processes remain effective as configured to meet secondary treatment standards.

Finally, there was no violation of the MRP No 00-044 during the period covered by this report.

The monitoring data indicate that compliance with the Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) and Monitoring Requirement Program (MRP) has been good, and no problems are anticipated for 2010.

The remainder of this section of the report includes data summaries and graphs of select data including those from the sampling methods including the new integrative method. All data referenced in this section are included in the Discharger Self- Monitoring Program, MRP No 00-044.




#### **WWTF FLOW INFLUENT REPORT - 2009**


### WWTF TOTAL SUSPENDED SOLIDS (TSS) REPORT - 2009


### WWTF 2009 - TOTAL ORGANIC CARBON (TOC) TREATMENT





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#### UPSET, INTERFERENCE, AND PASS-THROUGH


The pretreatment program had two broad review exercises where Plant and Program records were evaluated for local limits revision; and specifically for upsets, interferences and pass-through in 2009. These included the pretreatment compliance inspection (PCI), and the annual report development.

There was no incident of pass-through, interference or upset documented throughout the calendar year 2009. (Please refer to data and report summary in Section I. Analyses of Pollutants Identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act, Pollutants contributing to Pass-Through).

In addition to the review exercises, the pretreatment program was able to evaluate the influent and effluent loads of trace organic compounds; and commonly analyzed metals through the plant and into the discharge area. These were done through the implementation of the integrative sampling devices during the wet and dry seasons for the trace organic compounds (TrOC), and the review of semi-annual metals analyses in 2009. As a result of the implementation of the integrative sampling processes, it has been possible to evaluate the probable impacts of the pretreatment program to reduce the needless discharge of pharmaceuticals into the treatment plant, which was initiated in October 2007. In 2009, there were measurable levels of select trace organic compounds detectable in the influent and effluent due to the implementation of the implementation of the integrative sampling technologies. The levels detected in the effluence reflected no pass-through, and plant processes did not record any upsets.

The City is continuing to evaluate professional laboratories with expanded capabilities to develop a clearer evaluation of all the compounds in the State's Ocean Plan's Table B during 2009.

In conclusion, the data indicate that compliance with the WDR and MRP requirements has been good, and no problems are anticipated for 2009.



#### **BASELINE MONITORING REPORTS**

Industry Baseline Monitoring Reports (BMR) have been reviewed in order to reflect any changes undertaken by permitted industries during the course of 2009.

Changes in status include:

- One IU, City of Santa Cruz Water Department discontinued temporary wastewater discharge from its pilot desalination plant, which was operated under permit through June 2009. The discharge to sewer met the limits and conditions of the permit. The permit has been terminated with the successful completion of the project. The site was closed and treatment equipment was removed as of April 16, 2009.
- One IU, **Cal Clean (Beacon Station #3528)** was issued a temporary wastewater discharge permit for discharging treated water from a groundwater remediation system. The permit is now closed.
- One IU, **Sav-On-Gas** was issued a wastewater discharge permit for discharging treated water from a groundwater remediation system.
- One IU, **Valero** –installed an in-situ oxygen diffusion groundwater treatment remediation system on June 16, 2009. The previously installed groundwater pump and treat remediation system they had in place was dismantled, and they no longer discharge wastewater from the groundwater system into the City's sewer facility.

All Industrial Permit users were current through 2009, and as a result, no new permits were reissued for Industrial Users in 2009.


## **CITY OF SANTA CRUZ PRETREATMENT PROGRAM**INSTRUCTIONS FOR BASELINE MONITORING REPORT

Following are instructions for filling out the "Information Requirements for Baseline Monitoring Report" form:

- 1. Briefly describe the nature of business or service performed at this facility. This description should include all manufacturing processes, including those not related to the categorical industry (use additional sheets if necessary).
- 2. Give the production rate of this facility (usually given as an annual average production or monthly average).
- 3. Provide the appropriate Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code for this facility.
- 4. Self-explanatory.
- 5. Provide average and maximum waste flows from all regulated process streams. If process waste streams are combined either with other process waste streams or non-process (sanitary, cooling water, etc.) waste streams, these individual flow rates should be given.
- 6. Each industrial user will sample, analyze and report on all regulated pollutants specific to each process (refer to appropriate subcategory in regulations for specific pollutants). An attachment should be provided indicating the types of samples (i.e., grab, composite, flow proportioned) the frequency and number of samples; time, date, and locations of the sampling events; and certification that the method of analysis meets the regulatory requirements. The facility must ascertain whether it can meet the 30-day average, calculated average, daily maximum or calculated maximum limit.

  All pretreatment standards are process related and a facility must comply with the standard at the end of each regulated process. However, EPA recognizes that many facilities combine their wastewater process lines, cooling water, and sanitary wastes prior to treatment or discharge to municipal sewers. Hence, a facility can sample at a combined point, but will need to adjust the categorical limit by employing the *Combined wastestream formula* which is contained in Section 403.6(e) of the General Pretreatment Regulations (Federal Register January 28, 1981). If this is the case with your facility, you must employ the formula and provide all additional data used for calculations. For further explanation, please refer to 40 CFR 403.6(e).
- 7. If answer was yes, skip Question 8, and go to Question 9.
- 8. An explanation is needed describing how the facility intends to meet Categorical Standards. If additional pretreatment and/or operations and maintenance are required, then an attachment must be provided describing the proposed system and a schedule of dates for commencement and completion of events leading to the construction and operation of the system.
- 9. Any other environmental control permits (i.e., NPDES, hazardous material, etc.) held by this facility must be listed.



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#### 2009 FOURTH QUARTERLY STATUS REPORT

The following section includes significant program activities completed during the fourth quarter of 2009, including the compliance table and narrative summary of industrial users in violation of applicable pretreatment standards in the fourth quarter of 2009.

During the fourth quarter of 2009, program management and staff updated the Enforcement Response Plan (ERP) as a result of the Pretreatment Compliance Inspection concluded with Tetra-Tech earlier in the quarter. The remainder of this section includes the narrative and table summary for the lone industrial user found to be in violation of the pretreatment program during the fourth quarter.

# City of Santa Cruz PRETREATMENT PROGRAM

Fourth Quarter 2009, Summary Attachment

**AQUARIUS BOAT WORKS (ABW)** – ABW's self-monitoring was done three days past their permit's timeline for the semi-annual monitoring event. The owner/manager indicated that problems with a new employee hired to run their pretreatment system affected their ability to do monitoring which resulted in late self-monitoring. He confirmed that he is aware of the time-frame and will monitor appropriately during the correct monitoring period January – June in 2010.

**BAY PHOTO** – Bay Photo paid a \$1,500 fine, and submitted a written report explaining the cause of a silver discharge violation reported during the third quarter of 2009. Subsequent silver monitoring showed compliance and Bay Photo has met the City's deadlines and requirements. Negotiations are under way for installing a sampling manhole for the discharger and to review the appropriate species of silver to test from the effluent of Bay Photo.

**FOLKS CAFÉ** – is a vehicle service facility and is not a permitted industry. The City inspects vehicle service facilities annually for compliance with our storm water and sewer use ordinances. During a routine inspection on December 16, 2009, violations of the City's Storm Water Ordinance and hazardous waste storage regulations were observed. These were repeat violations and the owner had previously been issued Notices of Violation (NOV), written and verbal warnings. Because of this repeated lack of compliance, on January 8, 2010, Folks Café was issued an NOV, required to submit plans to properly store hazardous materials and submit a fine for the amount of \$500 by February 8, 2010.

HARMONY FOODS – violated the local limit for Total Suspended Solids three times out of sixteen sampling events for Total Suspended Solids during the fourth quarter. A Written Warning and a Notice of Violation have been issued consistent with the Enforcement Response Plan (ERP). Harmony increased sampling frequencies for TSS and hired a consultant to study what factors could be contributing to these intermittent violations and for making recommendations to the pretreatment processes for resolution of the issue. This study produced inconclusive results for isolating the causation and Harmony has requested variance from the Local Limit of 1,000 mg/L TSS. The request is being evaluated within the Local Limits revision exercise, as well as a review of the Industrial User's permit.

SECTION VI. SUMMARY OF COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

#### SUMMARY OF COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

The following pages contain a summary of the compliance and enforcement activities relating to the permitted industrial users within the purview of the City of Santa Cruz Pretreatment Program during the calendar year 2009. The section also includes a table of enforcement activities of all permitted dischargers during 2009, in Santa Cruz.

**ALMAR CLEANERS** – was in compliance throughout 2009.

**AQUARIUS BOAT WORKS** –was in compliance throughout 2009. However, as stated in the fourth quarterly report, their second semi-annual self-monitoring was done three days past the monitoring time-frame.

BAY PHOTO – has been inconsistently achieving compliance throughout 2009. During the second quarter, Bay Photo had a silver discharge violation of 75ppm. A Notice a Violation (NOV) was issued requiring them to submit a \$1,500 fine, a written report explaining the cause of the violation and actions taken to prevent future violations, and to install a sampling manhole. Subsequent silver monitoring has shown compliance and Bay Photo has met the City's deadlines and requirements. Bay Photo's permit limit for silver is being evaluated for appropriate species (dissolved or total) and for compositing samples rather than grab samples. Bay Photo's permit will be renewed with these considerations in place by the second quarter of 2010.

BARITEAU'S CLEANERS – was in compliance throughout 2009.

**BEACH CITY GAS STATION** – was in compliance throughout 2009.

**CLASSIC CLEANERS** – failed to sample and report within the required monitoring timeframe during the third quarter of 2009. A written warning was issued requiring the sampling to be performed and the data with report to be submitted within 30 days of the due date. Classic Cleaners have since returned to compliance.

FINS COFFEE (BEACH CITY GAS STATION), (treated groundwater discharger) – was in compliance throughout 2009.

HARMONY FOODS – inconsistently achieved compliance for total suspended solids (TSS) throughout 2009. Monitoring exercises by the City and by Harmony Foods found 4 out of 20 samples taken from wastewater were in excess of the TSS limit (1,000 mg/L). A verbal and written warning was issued to Harmony Foods in response to these violations in 2009. Harmony Foods requested an opportunity to

work with some consultants on process engineering in an effort to improve compliance. The IU was given 60 days during the first quarter of 2009 to complete additional sampling research while testing the efficacy of polymers being introduced to the existing pre-treatment system. Harmony has reported that those efforts did not improve their ability to consistently meet the discharge limit of 1,000 mg/L. Therefore they are working with the City to revise the TSS load specified within their permit.

Harmony's violations of the local limits for total suspended solids were sporadic, and in spite of their improved process engineering efforts, the IU may not be able to meet the stringent discharge limit of 1,000 mg/L. Since the violations are not considered severe and have not caused operational issues at the Wastewater Treatment Facility, the request for a different TSS limit is being assessed along with similar ones from other dischargers within the context of the Local Limit revision exercise at the facility.

**PERSYS ENGINEERING** – was in compliance throughout 2009.

**SANTA CRUZ BIOTECHNOLOGY** – was in compliance throughout 2009.

SANTA CRUZ CLASS III LANDFILL - was in compliance throughout 2009.

**SANTA CRUZ COUNTY FLEET SERVICES/RRM** – (treated groundwater discharger) – was in compliance throughout 2009.

**SANTA CRUZ WATER PLANT (Graham Hill Rd)** – was in compliance throughout 2009.

**SANTA CRUZ WATER DEPARTMENT - Pilot Desalination Plant** – failed to sample weekly for TSS as required by the permit. A written warning was issued requiring a return to weekly sampling. All sampling performed by the discharger and the City have been in compliance. The Pilot Desalination plant has since concluded its run, and all equipment was removed from the site as of April 16, 2009.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AT SANTA CRUZ (UCSC) – was in compliance throughout 2009.

**VALERO (SOQUEL AVE.)** – The groundwater pump and treat remediation system was dismantled and removed on April 27 and 28, 2009 as approved by the Regional Water Quality Control Board. A previously approved iSOC or in-situ oxygen diffusion groundwater treatment remediation system was installed on June 16, 2009.

Therefore, Valero will no longer be discharging to the City's sanitary sewer system and their wastewater discharge permit will expire on January 10, 2011.




#### PRETREATMENT PROGRAM CHANGES

The Pretreatment program at the City of Santa Cruz has included responsibilities for storm water monitoring and inspections since 2003, and since 2007, the program has utilized the integrated high volume water sampling technologies of SPMD (Semi Permeable Membrane Devices) to calculate potential effluent loads and pass through of trace organics in the effluent.

Additionally, in October 2007, the City initiated the safe and responsible disposal of unwanted pharmaceuticals as a free program to the community and to prevent their common discharge into the sewer system, which is an ineffective mechanism of keeping them out of the ocean and surface waters. Otherwise, there are few program changes to report for 2009.

Three of the significant program developments in 2009 are as follows:

- 1. MAHLs and Local Limits: The City engaged the services of Kennedy-Jenks Associates to guide the data reduction and communication efforts with the Water board (Region III), in finalizing the Local Limits revision exercise at the City in 2009. The final product is expected to be rolled out through a public process in the second quarter of 2010.
- 2. <u>Compounds of Emerging Concern</u>: The Pretreatment program analyzed the data from simultaneous deployment of an integrative sampling technology into monitoring for trace and toxicologically significant compounds at the end of the dry weather season in 2009. The analyses indicate that the compounds do not currently pose challenges for violations and/or pass-through at the facility. And
- 3. **Program Organization and Staffing:** The Pretreatment program finally filled the vacancy for a third Environmental Compliance Inspector position in August 2009. This allowed the implementation of a geographic grid of responsibility within City limits for staff Inspectors, and consequently this should translate to more proactive inspections, patrols, and more effective intervention.



#### PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

The following section consists of a few highlights of the public outreach and public participation events of the Pretreatment program staff and management in the year 2009, and a planned public participation event for 2010; as follows:

- 1. Planned Public Participation Event:

  During the early summer weeks of 2010, it is anticipated that there will be a public roll out and review of the revised Local Limits for the City of Santa Cruz. This event will be captured on the Community Cable Television service as part of the ongoing relationship with the Pretreatment program.
- 2. The annual publication of significant violators for 2008, as required by 40 CFR403.8(f) (2) (vii), was accomplished in January 2009. One Industrial user violated the pretreatment program elements to the status of SNC for 2008. An image of the local newspaper page containing the publication is attached herewith, and a copy of the proof of publication for the SNC will be included within the next communication to the Water Board.
- 3. Program staff and management participated in activities marking **Pollution Prevention Week** in September 14-21 2009. Program activities highlighted the success of the citywide efforts to remove unwanted pharmaceuticals from the wastewater treatment system. The City also introduced a program to enable charity car washes to divert car wash waste waters from storm drains into nearby sewer connections during the event at the Inn at the Pasatiempo.
- 4. The WAVE award (Western States Award for Visual Arts Excellence) was awarded to the Santa Cruz Community Cable TV for the program to prevent the continued disposal of unwanted medications and pharmaceuticals through the area's wastewater treatment works. The program was developed from a script approved and funded by the Environmental Compliance program in 2007.
- 5. Program staff and management participated in **World Water Monitoring Day** in October 2009. Activities included ordering and distribution of posters created for the California Department of Toxic Substances for the event.
- 6. Environmental Compliance program staff and management participated at the annual **Public Works Safety Day** in May 2009. The program events focused on sustainable practices in the watershed and community.







# Analysis Of Pollutants Identified In Section 307(A) Of The Clean Water Act, Pollutants Contributing to Pass-Through


This section of the report contains data summaries, graphs and narratives to provide analyses of pollutants identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act (CWA) for samples of POTW influent, effluent and dewatered sludge that might have contributed to pass-through in 2008.

The pretreatment program and the laboratory have used integrative sampling technologies to evaluate the fate of trace organic compounds through the wastewater treatment facility since the approval of those technologies by the Water Board in 2005. In order to provide data on trace constituents that might fall into this category, the Regional Water Quality Control Board approved the use of integrative high volume water samplers in the influent and effluent of the City of Santa Cruz wastewater treatment facility in its Board Order no R3-2005-0003 in May 2005. This novel process, originally developed by the United States Geological Survey (USGS) utilizes the fugacity of trace organic compounds in water to sequester the compounds into a semipermeable membrane, at standard temperatures over a longer period of typically 30 days. The membrane is processed under license and a patent agreement granted by USGS to Environmental Sampling Technologies, Inc. (EST), St. Joseph, MO. Thereafter the ampoules of chemical extracts are analyzed with approved EPA analytical methods. Many compounds are then amenable to analysis and subsequent development of effective source control measures. The near-simultaneous implementation of this integrative sampling method at the influent and effluent stations of the facility allows the pretreatment program to assess pass-through to the effluent of the facility. Data from the processes have been analyzed for evidence of pass-through for compounds that have become amenable to analyses. The data are presented subsequently in this section, and they indicate that although many of the previously detectable compounds were not measurable in the influent and effluent in 2008, the decline in the concentration and variety of trace organic compounds detectable at the influent and effluent of the wastewater treatment facility during 2008, continues to be better than the data compiled for 2007. Finally, there was no violation of the MRP No 00-044 during the period covered by this report. The monitoring data indicate that compliance with the Waste Discharge Requirements (WDR) and Monitoring Requirement Program (MRP) has been good, and no problems are anticipated for 2009.

The remainder of this section of the report includes data summaries and graphs of select data including those from the sampling methods including the new integrative method. Additionally, all data referenced in this section are included in the Discharger Self-Monitoring Program, MRP No 00-044.



WWTF Flow Report - 2008





Total Suspended Solids (TSS) Report - 2008



WWTF Total Organic Carbon Load - 2008




WWTF Total Organic Carbon (TOC) Removal Efficiency 2008

Section II. Upset, Interference, and Pass-Through

#### UPSET, INTERFERENCE, AND PASS-THROUGH

The pretreatment program had two broad review exercises where Plant and Program records were evaluated for upsets, interferences and pass-through in 2008. These included the preparatory exercises for the pretreatment compliance inspection (PCI), and the annual report development.

There was no incident of pass-through, interference or upset documented throughout the calendar year 2008. (Please refer to data and report summary in Section I. Analyses of Pollutants Identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act, Pollutants contributing to Pass-Through.).

In addition to the review exercises, the pretreatment program was able to evaluate the influent and effluent loads of trace organic compounds through the plant and into the discharge area. This was done through the implementation of the integrative sampling devices during the wet and dry seasons, and the review of parallel information developed by CCLEAN through its 30-day flow based composite sampling and analyses.

As a result of the implementation of the integrative sampling processes, it has been possible to evaluate the probable impacts of the pretreatment program to reduce the needless discharge of pharmaceuticals into the treatment plant, which was initiated in October 2007. In 2008, levels of trace organic compounds detectable in the influent and effluent were below laboratory detection limits for the first time since the implementation of the integrative sampling technologies. has been made in evaluating trace organic compounds for pass-through in 2008.

The City is continuing to evaluate professional laboratories with expanded capabilities to develop a clearer evaluation of the compounds in the State's modifications to the Ocean Plan during 2009.

In conclusion, the data indicate that compliance with the WDR and MRP requirements has been good, and no problems are anticipated for 2009.



#### **BASELINE MONITORING REPORTS**

Industry Baseline Monitoring Reports (BMR) have been reviewed in order to reflect any changes undertaken by permitted industries during the course of 2008.

Changes in status include:

- One **IU**, **City of Santa Cruz Water Department** was reissued a temporary wastewater discharge permit for discharging wastewater from its pilot desalination plant. The discharge to sewer has met the limits and conditions of the permit. The IU has continued to update the pretreatment program on a quarterly basis.
- One IU, **Fin's Coffee (former Beach City Gas Station)** was issued a wastewater discharge permit for discharging treated water from a groundwater remediation system.
- One IU, **Santa Cruz County Fleet Services** was issued a wastewater discharge permit for discharging treated water from a groundwater remediation system.
- One IU, **Sav-On-Gas** was issued a wastewater discharge permit for discharging treated water from a groundwater remediation system.

Permits were reissued for the following Industrial Users in 2008:

- Bariteau's Dry Cleaners
- Persys Engineering
- Santa Cruz Biotechnology
- University of California Santa Cruz

## **CITY OF SANTA CRUZ PRETREATMENT PROGRAM**INSTRUCTIONS FOR BASELINE MONITORING REPORT

Following are instructions for filling out the "Information Requirements for Baseline Monitoring Report" form:

- 1. Briefly describe the nature of business or service performed at this facility. This description should include all manufacturing processes, including those not related to the categorical industry (use additional sheets if necessary).
- 2. Give the production rate of this facility (usually given as an annual average production or monthly average).
- 3. Provide the appropriate Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code for this facility.
- 4. Self-explanatory.
- 5. Provide average and maximum waste flows from all regulated process streams. If process waste streams are combined either with other process waste streams or non-process (sanitary, cooling water, etc.) waste streams, these individual flow rates should be given.
- 6. Each industrial user will sample, analyze and report on all regulated pollutants specific to each process (refer to appropriate subcategory in regulations for specific pollutants). An attachment should be provided indicating the types of samples (i.e., grab, composite, flow proportioned) the frequency and number of samples; time, date, and locations of the sampling events; and certification that the method of analysis meets the regulatory requirements. The facility must ascertain whether it can meet the 30-day average, calculated average, daily maximum or calculated maximum limit.

  All pretreatment standards are process related and a facility must comply with the standard at the end of each regulated process. However, EPA recognizes that many facilities combine their wastewater process lines, cooling water, and sanitary wastes prior to treatment or discharge to municipal sewers. Hence, a facility can sample at a combined point, but will need to adjust the categorical limit by employing the *Combined wastestream formula* which is contained in Section 403.6(e) of the General Pretreatment Regulations (Federal Register January 28, 1981). If this is the case with your facility, you must employ the formula and provide all additional data used for calculations. For further explanation, please refer to 40 CFR 403.6(e).
- 7. If answer was yes, skip Question 8, and go to Question 9.
- 8. An explanation is needed describing how the facility intends to meet Categorical Standards. If additional pretreatment and/or operations and maintenance are required, then an attachment must be provided describing the proposed system and a schedule of dates for commencement and completion of events leading to the construction and operation of the system.
- 9. Any other environmental control permits (i.e., NPDES, hazardous material, etc.) held by this facility must be listed.

During the fourth quarter of 2008, program management and staff updated the Enforcement Response Plan (ERP) as a result of the Pretreatment Compliance Inspection concluded with Tetra-Tech earlier in the quarter. # City of Santa Cruz PRETREATMENT PROGRAM

Fourth Quarter 2008, Summary Attachment

HARMONY FOODS – violated the local limit for Total Suspended Solids three times out of sixteen sampling events for Total Suspended Solids during the fourth quarter. A Written Warning and a Notice of Violation have been issued consistent with the Enforcement Response Plan (ERP). Harmony increased sampling frequencies for TSS and hired a consultant to study what factors could be contributing to these intermittent violations and for making recommendations to the pretreatment processes for resolution of the issue. This first study produced inconclusive results for isolating the causation and Harmony has committed to completing a second study during the early part of first quarter of 2009.

#### SUMMARY OF COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

The following pages contain a summary of the compliance and enforcement activities relating to the permitted industrial users within the purview of the City of Santa Cruz Pretreatment Program during the calendar year 2008. The section also includes a table of enforcement activities of all permitted dischargers during 2008, in Santa Cruz.

**ALMAR CLEANERS** – was in compliance throughout 2008.

**AQUARIUS BOATWORKS** – was in compliance throughout 2008.

BARITEAU'S CLEANERS – was in compliance throughout 2008.

**BAY PHOTO** – was issued a new permit on July 17, 2008. They have been in compliance throughout 2008.

**BEACH CITY GAS STATION** – was in compliance throughout 2008.

**CLASSIC CLEANERS** – failed to sample and report within the required monitoring timeframe during the third quarter of 2008. A written warning was issued requiring the sampling to be performed and the data with report to be submitted within 30 days of the due date. Classic Cleaners have since returned to compliance.

FINS COFFEE (BEACH CITY GAS STATION), (treated groundwater discharger) – was in compliance throughout 2008.

HARMONY FOODS – inconsistently achieved compliance for total suspended solids (TSS) throughout 2008. City monitoring results from June 25<sup>th</sup> and July 29<sup>th</sup> showed TSS violations of 1,268ppm and 2,235ppm respectively. Verbal and written warnings were given and Harmony Foods committed to sampling on a weekly basis during the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2008.

In addition to extra sampling, Harmony hired a consultant to assess the cause of the elevated TSS results and began servicing the pre-treatment system separation tanks more frequently. Fourth quarter sampling data indicate that Harmony Foods is intermittently out of compliance for TSS. A Notice of Violation (NOV) was issued for the data that was out of compliance in the fourth quarter. Since the violations are not considered severe and have not caused operational issues at the Wastewater Treatment Facility, Harmony Foods has been given 60 days during the first quarter of 2009 to complete additional sampling research while testing the efficacy of polymers being introduced to the existing pre-treatment system.

**PERSYS ENGINEERING** – was in compliance throughout 2008.

**SANTA CRUZ BIOTECHNOLOGY** – was in compliance throughout 2008.

SANTA CRUZ CLASS III LANDFILL - was in compliance throughout 2008.

**SANTA CRUZ COUNTY FLEET SERVICES/RRM** (treated groundwater discharger) – was in compliance throughout 2008.

SANTA CRUZ WATER PLANT (Graham Hill Rd) – was in compliance throughout 2008.

**SANTA CRUZ WATER DEPARTMENT - Pilot Desalination Plant** – failed to sample weekly for TSS as required by the permit. A written warning was issued requiring a return to weekly sampling. All sampling performed by the discharger and the City have been in compliance. The Pilot Desalination plant has since returned to full compliance.

**SAV-ON-GAS** (treated groundwater discharger) – was in compliance throughout 2008.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AT SANTA CRUZ (UCSC) – was in compliance throughout 2008.

**VALERO (MISSION ST.)** – has continued using in-situ oxygen diffusion groundwater treatment remediation for this site. There has been zero discharge to sewer from this site throughout 2008. Valero's groundwater discharge permit expired on September 1, 2008.

**VALERO** (**SOQUEL AVE.**) – was in compliance throughout 2008.





#### PRETREATMENT PROGRAM CHANGES

The Pretreatment program at the City of Santa Cruz has included responsibilities for storm water monitoring and inspections since 2003, and since 2007, the program has utilized the integrated high volume water sampling technologies of SPMD (Semi Permeable Membrane Devices) to calculate potential effluent loads and pass through of trace organics in the effluent. Additionally, in October 2007, the City initiated the safe and responsible disposal of unwanted pharmaceuticals as a free program to the community and to prevent their common discharge into the sewer system, which is an ineffective mechanism of keeping them out of the ocean and surface waters. Otherwise, there are few program changes to report for 2008. The most significant program developments in 2008 include the following:

- 1. Suspension of the preparatory efforts to reassess the Local Limits and Maximum Allowable Headworks Limits (MAHLs). This decision was made as a result of the reduction in staffing with the departure of an Environmental Compliance Inspector in 2008. And
- 2. The Pretreatment program initiated the deployment of an integrative sampling technology into monitoring for trace and toxicologically significant compounds at the end of the dry weather season in 2008. (See comments above).



## PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

- 1. The annual publication of significant violators for 2008, as required by 40 CFR403.8(f) (2) (vii), was accomplished in January 2009. No Industrial user violated the pretreatment program elements to the status of SNC for 2008. An image of the local newspaper page containing the publication is attached herewith, and a copy of the proof of publication for the SNC will be included within the next communication to the Water Board.
- 2. Program staff and management participated in activities marking **Pollution Prevention Week** in September 14-21 2008. Program activities highlighted the success of the citywide efforts to remove unwanted pharmaceuticals from the wastewater treatment system. The City recognized is Police Department and two local pharmacists for their contribution to the effort that resulted in the collection and incineration of about nine hundred pounds of unwanted medicines in 10 months.
- 3. Program staff and management participated in **World Water Monitoring Day** in October 2008. Activities included ordering and distribution of posters created for the California Department of Toxic Substances for the event.
- 4. Environmental Compliance program staff and management participated at the annual **Public Works Day** in May 2008. The program events focused on sustainable practices in the watershed and community.



## SECTION I: ANALYSIS OF POLLUTANTS IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 307(A) OF THE CLEAN WATER ACT, POLLUTANTS CONTRIBUTING TO PASS-THROUGH

This section of the report contains data summaries, graphs and narratives to provide analyses of pollutants identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act (CWA) for samples of POTW influent, effluent and dewatered sludge that might have contributed to pass-through in 2006.

In order to provide data on trace constituents that might fall into this category, the Regional Water Quality Control Board approved the use of integrative high volume water sampler in the influent and effluent of the City of Santa Cruz wastewater treatment facility in its Board Order no R3-2005-0003 in May 2005. This novel process, originally developed by the United States Geological Survey (USGS) utilizes the fugacity of trace organic compounds in water to sequester the compounds into a semi-permeable membrane, at standard temperatures over a longer period of typically 30 days. The membrane is processed under license and a patent agreement granted by USGS to Environmental Testing Services (ETS), St. Joseph, MO. Thereafter the ampoules of chemical extracts are analyzed with approved EPA analytical methods. Many compounds are then amenable to analysis and subsequent control measures. The near-simultaneous implementation of this integrative sampling method at the influent and effluent stations of the facility allows the pretreatment program to assess pass-through to the effluent of the facility. Data from the processes have been analyzed for evidence of pass-through for compounds that have become amenable to analyses. The data are presented subsequently in this section.

There was only one (1) violation of the MRP No 00-044 during the period covered by this report, and the following is a narrative of the violation:


The minimum monthly average requirement for BOD removal in the plant's effluent was 85% until BOD limits were replaced with TOC per Board Order R3-2005-0003, as amended by letter on November 20, 2006. The lone violation of the BOD limit was in May 2006, when the average monthly BOD removal was 84.04%. Plant process information and performance data were reviewed for analyses of this violation. There was no discernible cause of the violation for the violation other than that plant effluent BOD values were relatively high for May 2006, although the monthly average for effluent was within permit limits and the national secondary standards.

Finally, the data indicate that compliance with the WDR and MRP requirements has been good, and no problems are anticipated for 2007.

The remainder of this section of the report includes data summaries and graphs of select data including those from the sampling methods including the new integrative method. Additionally, all data referenced in this section are included in the Discharger Self-Monitoring Program, MRP No 00-044.



## Daily Effluent Flows (2006)





## Load Reduction Efficiency (%TSS Reduction) - 2006





# II. Upset, Interference, and Pass-Through

The pretreatment program had three distinct review exercises where Plant and program records were evaluated for upsets, interferences and pass-through in 2006. These included the pretreatment compliance inspection (PCI), the pretreatment compliance audit (PCA) and the annual report development.

There was no incident of pass-through, interference or upset documented throughout the calendar year 2006. (Please refer to data and report summary in Section I. Analyses of Pollutants Identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act, Pollutants contributing to Pass-Through.)

As a result of the initial implementation of the integrative sampling processes, progress has been made in evaluating trace organic compounds for pass-through in 2006. Although analyses for trace organic compounds were performed with integrative sampling methods followed by analytical methods and provisions of 40CFR 136, many trace compounds were below laboratory detection

#### III. BASELINE MONITORING REPORTS

Industry Baseline Monitoring Reports (BMR) have been reviewed in order to reflect any changes undertaken by permitted industries during the course of 2006.

Changes in status include:

One **IU**, **Beach City Gas Station (Groundwater Discharge)** – informed the pretreatment program of their business closure and future intentions through phone dialogue and e-mails. This Gas Station/Food Store closed business on March 2006. Groundwater Discharge Permit # GW0016 was terminated at the end of March 2006. A new long term groundwater discharge permit, # GW0018, has been issued to address future groundwater extraction, treatment, and sewer discharge. This site is currently waiting for plan approval to proceed with the construction of a coffee shop.

One **IU**, **City of Santa Cruz Water Department** – was issued a new Wastewater Discharge Permit for a proposed Desalination Pilot Plant that is not in operation yet. Consequently, no discharge to sewer has taken place and no sampling has been performed to date. The IU has continued to update the pretreatment program on a quarterly basis that the project is not yet in operation.

One **SIU**, **Santa Cruz Port District** – did not operate their bilge water pump out system throughout 2006. They have reconfigured the system so it no longer requires oil separation and subsequent pretreatment and disposal to the POTW. Therefore, SC Port District will no longer be required to monitor semi-annually or renew their permit in 2007. The system collects bilge water only and it is hauled off site for disposal by a local HAZMAT handler. Manifests will be reviewed at future inspections.

One **IU**, **Valero Gas Station**, (**Mission Street**) - informed the pretreatment program of their business closure and future intentions through phone dialogue and e-mails. This Gas Station has discontinued on-site groundwater extraction, treatment, and discharge to sanitary sewer. This site is now using in-situ oxygen diffusion remediation which requires zero discharge to sanitary sewer.

#### VI. SUMMARY OF COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

The following pages summarize the compliance and enforcement activities relating to the permitted industrial users within the purview of the City of Santa Cruz Pretreatment Program during the calendar year 2006. The section also includes a table describing the enforcement activities of all permitted dischargers during 2006 in the area.

**ALMAR CLEANERS** - was in compliance throughout 2006.

**AQUARIUS BOAT WORKS** – Failed to submit their first semi-annual self-monitoring report by July 10, 2006. A Notice of Violation (NOV) was issued on July 13, 2006. The report was received by the required due date in the NOV. City monitoring results from June 12, 2006 show a copper violation. The copper concentration was 1.4ppm which violates the City limit of 0.75ppm. An NOV was issued on July 11, 2007 requiring them to re-sample and submit the analytical data by August 14, 2006. Data was received on September 15, 2006. Subsequent data received throughout the remainder of 2006 was submitted on time and in compliance with the City's local limits.

BARITEAU'S DRY CLEANING - was in compliance throughout 2006.

**BEACH CITY GAS STATION** – (Groundwater Discharger) – closed business on March 2006. Groundwater Discharge Permit # GW0016 was terminated at the end of March 2006. This site was issued a temporary construction groundwater discharge permit, # GW0017, for site tank removal and demolition dewatering for the month of June 2006. Groundwater extraction, treatment, and discharge will be re-established as part of the new construction. A two year groundwater discharge permit # GW0018, issued on 10/27/06, will address future groundwater extraction, treatment, and sewer discharge requirements. This site is currently waiting for plan approval to proceed with the construction of a coffee shop.

**CLASSIC CLEANERS** – was in compliance throughout 2006.

**DEL MAR CLEANERS** – was in compliance throughout 2006.

**HARMONY FOODS** – was in compliance throughout 2006.

PERSYS ENGINEERING – was in compliance throughout 2006.

**PORT DISTRICT** – did not operate their bilge pump out system throughout 2006. They have reconfigured the system so it no longer requires oil separation and subsequent pretreatment and disposal to the POTW. Therefore, SC Port District will no longer be required to monitor semi-annually or renew their permit in 2007. The system collects bilge water only and it is hauled off site for disposal by a local HAZMAT handler. Manifests will be reviewed at future inspections.

**SANTA CRUZ BIOTECHNOLOGY** - was in compliance throughout 2006.

SANTA CRUZ CLASS III LANDFILL – was in compliance throughout 2006.

**SANTA CRUZ SENTINEL** - was in compliance throughout 2006.

**SANTA CRUZ WATER PLANT** (Graham Hill Rd) – was in compliance throughout 2006.

**SANTA CRUZ WATER DEPARTMENT** (Pilot Desalination Plant) – was in compliance

**SHELL SERVICE STATION** – was closed through out 2006. Shell is evaluating remediation alternatives for this site. Environmental consultants, Delta Environmental, will notify RWQCB and CSCWPCF prior to system restart.

**U-DO-IT CAR WASH** – was in compliance through out 2006.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AT SANTA CRUZ (UCSC) – was in compliance throughout 2006.

**VALERO (Mission St.)** – was in compliance during the first quarter of 2006. Valero's ground water treatment system was shut down and removed from site on March 23, 2006 due to a decrease in hydrocarbons in the monitoring wells. During August 2006, Valero installed in-situ oxygen diffusion groundwater treatment remediation equipment.

VALERO (Soquel Ave.) – was in compliance during the first quarter of 2006. During the second quarter, management of this site was transferred from Alisto Engineering Group to Delta Engineering Group. Alisto Engineering failed to monitor once during the second quarter (April) 2006. A NOV was issued to Alisto. Monitoring samples for March and May were both in compliance with local discharge limits. During the third quarter Delta failed to monitor once during September. A follow up phone call and e-mail warning was issued. Sample results for August and October were both in compliance with local discharge limits. Delta Engineering is in the process of working

with Ultramar representatives to identify any needed operational modifications to prevent automatic system shut down. **VAPOR CLEANERS** - was in compliance throughout 2006. **VAPOR CLEANERS** (Ground water discharge) – was in compliance throughout 2006. **WILSON RIVER STREET** – was in compliance throughout 2006.

#### VII. Pretreatment Program Changes

The Pretreatment program at the City of Santa Cruz has included responsibilities for storm water monitoring and inspections since 2003. Otherwise, there are few program changes to report for 2006. The most significant program developments in 2006 include the following:

- 1. Preparation for Local Limits and Maximum Allowable Headworks Limits (MAHLs)
- 2. Integrative sampling technologies in lieu of VOC grab sampling for Influent load calculations and overview of pass-through in the effluent.

#### Local Limits and MAHLs:

Several informal internal program audits conducted between 2003 and 2005 revealed that the program needed to recalculate data used to derive the local limits because several major dischargers into the treatment plant had left the city. These industrial dischargers contributed a significant proportion of the data used to derive the MAHLs prior to 1998, and therefore they influenced the values derived for the local limits. In addition the County Sanitation District performed significant maintenance activities on the conveyance system into the facility and reduced the flow and strength of sewage previously attributed to the county. Therefore the program developed an outline of a plan to collect data from sources of discharge to the facility by the end of 2007. The initial outlines were communicated to the Regional Board through quarterly reports, and in the course of the PCI and PCA undertaken in 2006. Initial data are being analyzed for VOCs in influent and effluent collected at the end of 2006. The program will continue through the end of 2007.

#### Integrative Sampling in lieu of VOC grab sampling:

The Pretreatment program initiated the deployment of an integrative sampling technology into monitoring for trace and toxicologically significant compounds at the end of the dry weather season in 2006. (See comments above). This deployment enables the program to apply validated EPA methods to analyze for trace organic compounds that would otherwise be below their detection limits. The initial deployment has already provided some data to assess program effectiveness at managing pass-through in 2006. (See Section I of this annual report).





# SECTION I: ANALYSIS OF POLLUTANTS IDENTIFIED IN SECTION 307(A) OF THE CLEAN WATER ACT, POLLUTANTS CONTRIBUTING TO PASS-THROUGH

Analyses of pollutants identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act (CWA) for samples of POTW influent, effluent and dewatered sludge were conducted throughout 2007. Two significant changes were implemented in the pretreatment program to implement the successful analyses of pollutants identified under Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act. These are:

- 1. The near-simultaneous implementation of high volume integrative sampling for trace organic compounds for thirty (30) days at the effluent and influent in 2007. This representative method of sampling wastewater for trace organic compounds was approved by the Regional Water Quality Control Board in the NPDES permit issued to the City of Santa Cruz in May 2005. This novel process, originally developed by the United States Geological Survey (USGS) utilizes the fugacity of trace organic compounds in water to sequester the compounds into a semi-permeable membrane, at standard temperatures. The membranes were processed under license and a patent agreement granted by USGS to Environmental Testing Services (ETS), St. Joseph, MO. Thereafter the ampoules of chemical extracts were analyzed with approved EPA analytical methods. Many trace compounds and their congeners became amenable to analysis and should also be more amenable to control measures. The implementation of this integrative sampling method at the influent and effluent stations of the facility allowed the pretreatment program to assess pass-through to the effluent of the facility.
- 2. In May 2007, Plant management instituted a change in data objectives for assessing the quality of the Class B Biosolids generated at the facility in 2007, with reference to the Hazardous waste levels of its constituents per California Title 22. The previous frame of reference, specified under the NPDES permit was to analyze the biosolids quality for land application limits only. The new frame of reference is inclusive of more pollutants and a table of the analytical data summary data of the plant's biosolids now contains a column listing the threshold limit concentrations of inorganic and bioaccumulative toxic substances as identified in the California Water at Code Title 22.

The remainder of this section of the report includes data summaries and graphs of select data including those from the sampling methods utilizing Semi-Permeable Membrane Device (SPMD) as the high volume integrative method, and the threshold limit concentrations for biosolids. Additionally, all data referenced in this section are included in the Discharger Self-Monitoring Program, MRP No 00-044.

Finally, the data summaries indicate that compliance with the WDR and MRP requirements has been good, there was no violation of the MRP No 00-044 in 2007, and no problems are anticipated for 2008.



SECTION II	UPSET, INTERFERENCE, AND PASS-THROUGH

#### II. Upset, Interference, and Pass-Through

There was no incident of pass-through, interference or upset documented throughout the calendar year 2007. Please refer to data and report summary in Section I. Analyses of Pollutants Identified in Section 307(a) of the Clean Water Act, Pollutants contributing to Pass-Through.

As a result of the Reasonable Potential Analyses (RPA) performed on annualized plant effluent data derived from 24 hour composited samples through 2004, modifications were made to the permit to allow for improved monitoring of trace compounds and priority pollutants that might constitute pass-through. These modifications allow for the specific uses of integrative high volume sampling technologies to aggregate for trace organic compounds and other compounds of emerging concern (CEC), and subsequent analyses by EPA approved methods.

All analyses for trace metals and priority pollutants were performed within the methods and provisions of 40CFR 136, and many trace compounds are now detectable and quantifiable at levels above laboratory detection limits, when integrative sampling for thirty days are used.

In conclusion, the data indicate that compliance with the WDR and MRP requirements has been good, and no problems are anticipated for 2008.


#### III. BASELINE MONITORING REPORTS

This section includes a summary of the changes documented in the Baseline Monitoring reports in 2007. It also includes the cumulative number of industrial users notified of the Baseline Monitoring Reports (BMR) and the cumulative number of industrial users and their responses.

The Industry Baseline Monitoring Reports (BMR) was reviewed in order to reflect any changes undertaken by permitted industries during the course of 2007.

Changes in BMR and industrial users and responses in 2007 include:

- One IU, City of Santa Cruz Water Department was issued a new Wastewater Discharge Permit for a proposed Desalination Pilot Plant that is not in operation yet. Consequently, no discharge to sewer has taken place and no sampling has been performed to date.
- One IU, **Almar Dry Cleaners** discontinued using perchlorates and therefore did not need to have their permit renewed when it expired on 12/31/07.
- One SIU, **Santa Cruz Class III Landfill** was issued a new permit on October 11, 2007. Their permit expired on 9/14/07.
- One SIU, **Santa Cruz Sentinel** discontinued their newspaper press on April 29, 2007 and moved to San Jose. Their permit was not renewed when it expired on 1/14/08.
- One IU, **Beach City Gas Station (Groundwater Discharge)** informed our office of the completion and opening of Fin's Coffee on December 1, 2007.
- One IU, **Classic Cleaners** was issued a new permit on June 25, 2007. Classic is now under new ownership and continues to use perchlorates in the dry cleaning processes.
- One IU, **Del Mar Cleaners** discontinued using perchlorates and therefore did not need to have their permit renewed when it expired on 12/31/07.
- One IU, **Vapor Cleaners** discontinued using perchlorates and therefore did not need to have their permit renewed when it expired on 12/31/07.

#### INSTRUCTIONS FOR BASELINE MONITORING REPORT

Following are instructions for filling out the "Information Requirements for Baseline Monitoring Report" form:

- 1. Briefly describe the nature of business or service performed at this facility. This description should include all manufacturing processes, including those not related to the categorical industry (use additional sheets if necessary).
- 2. Give the production rate of this facility (usually given as an annual average production or monthly average).
- 3. Provide the appropriate Standard Industrial Classification (SIC) code for this facility.
- 4. Self-explanatory.
- 5. Provide average and maximum waste flows from all regulated process streams. If process waste streams are combined either with other process waste streams or non-process (sanitary, cooling water, etc.) waste streams, these individual flow rates should be given.
- 6. Each industrial user will sample, analyze and report on all regulated pollutants specific to each process (refer to appropriate subcategory in regulations for specific pollutants). An attachment should be provided indicating the types of samples (i.e., grab, composite, flow proportioned) the frequency and number of samples; time, date, and locations of the sampling events; and certification that the method of analysis meets the regulatory requirements. The facility must ascertain whether it can meet the 30-day average, calculated average, daily maximum or calculated maximum limit.

All pretreatment standards are process related and a facility must comply with the standard at the end of each regulated process. However, EPA recognizes that many facilities combine their wastewater process lines, cooling water, and sanitary wastes prior to treatment or discharge to municipal sewers. Hence, a facility can sample at a combined point, but will need to adjust the categorical limit by employing the Combined Waste stream Formula which is contained in Section 403.6(e) of the General Pretreatment Regulations (Federal Register January 28, 1981). If this is the case with your facility, you must employ the formula and provide all additional data used for calculations. For further explanation, please refer to 40 CFR 403.6(e).





### VI. SUMMARY OF COMPLIANCE AND ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITIES

**ALMAR CLEANERS** - was in compliance throughout 2007. As of August, 2007 they discontinued using Perchlorate. They switched to DF-2000 Fluid, a synthetic aliphatic hydrocarbon. Their permit expired on 12/31/07 and was not renewed due to the discontinued use of perchlorate.

**AQUARIUS BOAT WORKS** – inconsistently achieved compliance throughout 2007. City monitoring results from June 6, 2007 show a copper violation. The copper concentration was 1.9ppm which violates the City limit of 0.75ppm. A Notice of Violation (NOV) was issued on June 19, 2007, requiring them to re-sample and submit the analytical data by July 18, 2007. Data was received on July 17, 2007. Subsequent City monitoring and self-monitoring results were in compliance with the City's local limits throughout the remainder of 2007.

**BARITEAU'S DRY CLEANING** - was in compliance throughout 2007.

**BEACH CITY GAS STATION** - (Groundwater Discharger) – was issued a two year groundwater discharge permit, # GW0018, on 10/27/06. This site remained under construction for the remainder of 2006 and most of 2007. During this time the ground water extraction and treatment system was removed with zero discharge to sewer. On December 1, 2007 Fin's Coffee was completed and opened for business. Construction and implementation of a new groundwater extraction, treatment, and discharge system for this site remained incomplete for the remainder of 2007.

**CLASSIC CLEANERS** – was in compliance throughout 2007.

**DEL MAR CLEANERS** – was in compliance throughout 2007. As of January, 2007 they discontinued using perchlorate. They switched to DF-2000 Fluid, a synthetic aliphatic hydrocarbon. Their permit expired on 12/31/07 and was not renewed due to the discontinued use of perchlorate.

**HARMONY FOODS** – was in compliance throughout 2007.

PERSYS ENGINEERING – was in compliance throughout 2007.

SANTA CRUZ BIOTECHNOLOGY - was in compliance throughout 2007.

**SANTA CRUZ CLASS III LANDFILL** – was in compliance throughout 2007. Their permit expired on 9/14/07. They were issued a new permit on October 11, 2007.

**SANTA CRUZ SENTINEL** - was in compliance throughout 2007. The Sentinel Press stopped on Sunday April 29, 2007, and the newspaper operations were moved to San Jose. The site was inspected twice, on September 27, and October 5, 2007, to assess the site and ensure that all hazardous materials were adequately manifested and disposed of. Coordination for the site closure involved the Santa Cruz County Environmental Health who oversaw closure of the site. The building was vacated by December 31<sup>st</sup>, 2007. The Sentinel permit expired on January 14, 2008.

**SANTA CRUZ WATER PLANT (Graham Hill Rd)** – was in compliance throughout 2007.

**SANTA CRUZ WATER DEPARTMENT (Pilot Desalination Plant) –** This project remained under planning and construction throughout 2007.


SHELL SERVICE STATION – On January 10<sup>th</sup>, 2007, Delta Environmental Consultants requested termination of Shell Service Station groundwater discharge permit # GW007. On February 1, 2007 a letter was issued to Jeff Whitworth, Environmental Engineer – Shell Oil Products US, which officially terminated the ground water discharge permit for this site. There was no operational groundwater remediation at this site during 2007. Delta Environmental Consultants, on behalf of Shell Oil, will continue to evaluate alternative remediation for this site.

**U-DO-IT CAR WASH** – was in compliance throughout 2007. The wastewater Discharge Permit # NC0007, for this site, was subject to review for renewal on Jan 31, 2008. After reviewing the local limit discharge compliance data for the past three years it was determined that a wastewater discharge permit would no longer be necessary for this site. A letter was issued on December 6, 2007 to Norman Bei, owner of U-Do-It Car Wash, informing him of the pending non permit status for this site.

UNIVERSITY OF CALIFORNIA AT SANTA CRUZ (UCSC) – was in compliance throughout 2007.

**VALERO (MISSION ST.)** – has continued using in-situ oxygen diffusion groundwater treatment remediation for this site. There has been zero discharge to sewer from this site throughout 2007. Valero has opted to maintain an active groundwater discharge permit until the expiration date of September 1, 2008.

**VALERO (SOQUEL AVE.)** – In February 2007 environmental management for this site was transferred from Delta Environmental Consultants to Kadence Environmental Consultants. Valero, Soquel Ave., was in compliance throughout 2007.

## VII. Pretreatment Program Changes

The following section is a narrative of the most significant program changes to the City's Pretreatment Program during 2007. These changes including the following:

- 1. Development of influent level concentrations for trace organic compounds for recalculating Local Limits and Maximum Allowable Headworks Limits (MAHLs)
- 2. Development of diversion strategies for pharmaceuticals as pollutants refractory to conventional wastewater treatment processes.

#### Local Limits and MAHLs:

An internal program audit in 2005 revealed that the program needed to recalculate the data used to derive the local limits because several major dischargers into the treatment plant had left the city. These industrial dischargers contributed a significant proportion of the data used to derive the MAHLs prior to 1998, and therefore they influenced the values derived for the local limits. In addition, the County Sanitation District performed significant maintenance activities on the conveyance system into the facility and reduced the flow and strength of sewage previously attributed to the county. Therefore the program informed the pretreatment compliance auditors of these changes and secured funding to recalibrate the numeric and narrative values comprising the Local Limits. The exercise which began with selected sampling of conventional pollutants from trunklines feeding the headworks in 2006, began to acquire data on trace organic compounds in 2007. These data are presented in tabular form earlier in this report (See Section 1:

(at <u>Data derived from integrative sampling</u>; for trace organics begin with the table below)).

The next steps in the Local Limits development process will require the selection and engagement of professional engineering/consultancy services, which will begin in the next fiscal year.

# Development of Diversion strategies for pharmaceuticals from the wastewater treatment train:

The program instituted the collection and safe disposal of these compounds by installation of vaults at pharmacies and at the local Police Department in October 2007. This development followed comprehensive data review of the plant's (and similar treatment facilities) ability to remove trace organic compounds; pharmaceuticals and other personal care products after initiating integrative sampling at the influent and effluent of the facility in 2006 and 2007. Best management practices appear to be very effective low-cost mechanisms to control these compounds, which are refractory to treatment and challenging to quantify, and to prevent their pass-through. Working with

other agencies and the California legislature a bill supporting the collection and responsible diversion of pharmaceuticals from the wastewater treatment stream was conceived and signed into law by the state governor in October 2007.

The Pretreatment program had initiated the deployment of an integrative sampling technology into monitoring for trace and toxicologically significant compounds. This deployment will continue to allow the appropriate analyses of these compounds and will allow an accurate assessment of the ability of our programs to prevent pass-through. Prior methodologies had relied upon grab sampling and often returned data at censored levels. As a result of the City's efforts to improve its monitoring responsibilities to the Ocean Plan, these devices were acquired for the lab and the pretreatment programs. Results of these deployments will be useful in refining the local limits for dischargers to the facility.

## IX. Public Participation

The following section consists of a few highlights of the public outreach and public participation events of the Pretreatment program staff and management in the year 2007.

The annual publication of significant violators for the year 2007, as required by 40 CFR 403.8(f)(2)(vii), was accomplished in February 2008. A scanned copy of the proof of publication is attached to this section of the report.

The program's **Clean Ocean Business (COB)** published the list of businesses whose adherence to the best management practices (BMP) prescribed by the program have advanced the goals of maintaining the integrity of those systems. In addition to the publication of this annual list, the program makes decals for display by the businesses both as an incentive to the public to identify and support their efforts, as well as to invite other businesses to participate.

The program also initiated a concerted effort to divert unused pharmaceuticals from the sewer system after several studies and publications indicated their levels of pass-through and the deleterious effects in the discharge waters and sediments. The program funded and participated in the creation of a Community TV ad informing citizens of other and more responsible disposal options. These advertisements began to run in August 2007.

The Pretreatment program participated in the annual Currents, a regional program of information booths and interaction hosted by the Moss Landing Marine Laboratories to visitors and families. Program staff distributed information on activities and options to reduce and recycle waste products.

Environmental Compliance program staff provided Food Service Facilities with BMPs to address **FOG** (Food Oil and Grease) and mat washing issues to comply with Sewer and Storm Water Ordinances throughout 2007.

Environmental Compliance program staff and management participated at the annual **Public Works/Safety Day** in May 2007. An information booth including displays of posters, information on vehicle service facilities programs (VSF), landscaping, home maintenance activities with potential impacts on the sewer and storm water lines was manned by staff and management for the event.

Environmental Compliance program staff and management also participated at the annual National Night Out in May 2007. This annual event was coordinated by the Police Department and was used as an opportunity for the program to use an information booth to present posters, information on VSF, landscaping, home maintenance activities with potential impacts on the sewer and storm water lines.




