# PROGRAM OVERVIEW



#### PHASE 1: Classes and Coursework

Eight classes, including two field trips. Class homework involves course-related reading, videos, and waste audits.

#### CLASS 1:

Intro to the 6 R's of Sustainability and A Look At the State of Recycling

While we prioritize starting at Refuse and Rethink to reduce waste at the source, we know many people rely on Recycling as their primary waste management strategy.

#### CLASS 2:

Fieldtrip to the Resource Recovery Facility
See what happens to the 30-50 tons of material that Santa Cruzans place into their recycle bins every single day.

#### CLASS 3:

**Food Waste Prevention** 

In 2022, the average American threw away \$759 worth of uneaten groceries. Learn the truth about date labels and best practices to prevent food waste.

#### CLASS 4:

Diversion, Collection, & Processing of Food Waste

A look at how the City is meeting new state mandates to recover edible food and divert food scraps from our landfill.

#### CLASS 5:

**Rethink Your Habits** 

Field trip to the Grey Bears campus. Expand your knowledge of the R chain to include repair cafes, clothing swaps, and more. Show and tell with a local Waste Whiz on how you can rethink your purchases.

#### CLASS 6:

Green Businesses & Other City Programs

CA's Green Business program supports local businesses that are striving to help the community's sustainability goals. Plus, learn more about Waste Reduction programs the City offers.

#### CLASS 7:

Preparing to Share What You've Learned Review and summarize what we've learned thus far. We will set up the outreach booth and practice common outreach scenarios.



#### CLASS 8:

Launching into Phase 2, Volunteering
Guest presentation from the CityServe
Volunteer Coordinator. Plus, learn how easy it
is to reach 20 volunteer hours in the first year.
The class will conclude with a potluck and
swap.

#### PHASE 2: Community Outreach

Share what you learned through volunteer projects and service within the City of Santa Cruz. City staff organize volunteer opportunities like tabling at local events and the Downtown Farmers' Market, civic group presentations, and outreach (20 hours total).
